#### **ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: PS 43:1-2**

Give me justice, O God, and plead my cause against a nation that is faithless. From the deceitful and cunning rescue me, for you, O God, are my strength.

#### **READING I: Ez 37:12-14**

God promises to restore the people to their homeland and to give them a rebirth of faith.

#### **PSALM RESPONSE: PS 130**

"With the Lord there is mercy, and fullness of redemption."
Psalm 130 is another traditional "penitential psalm."

Like Psalm 51, it is used by the Church during seasons and rituals of repentance. It sings of another kind of "resurrection"—
the restoration of someone who is suffering,
who has experienced God's mercy, forgiveness, and redemption.

#### READING II: ROM 8:8-11

Paul uses "flesh" to mean those who have not come to belief in Christ and "spirit" to mean those who have.

For those who believe, the Spirit is at work restoring all of creation and raising it to the new life given us in Christ.

#### GOSPEL: JN 11:1-45

The story of Mary, Martha, and Lazarus makes some points similar to those made in the previous week's Gospel:

You need to see things from God's perspective in order to understand them. Jesus is the source of true life.

Though he is "the Christ, the Son of God," he is also very human, deeply touched by the sorrow of his friends at the death of Lazarus.

God is acting through him not only in this miracle but also throughout his ministry ("I know that you always hear me").

#### **COMMUNION ANTIPHON: JN 11:26**

Everyone who lives and believes in me will not die for ever, says the Lord.

#### A REFLECTION FROM FR. GIESE

One of my favorite scripture passages for difficult times is found in the Book of Habbakuk, chapter 3, verses 17-19:

"For though the fig tree blossom not nor fruit be on the vines,
Though the yield of the olive fail and the terraces produce no nourishment,
Though the flocks disappear from the fold and there be no herd in the stalls,
Yet will I rejoice in the LORD and exult in my saving God.
God, my Lord, is my strength;
He makes my feet swift as those of hinds and enables me to go upon the heights."

I read this at the conclusion of our weekly staff meeting recently and then adaptedd it to the current situation:

"For though the classrooms of our school are empty and there are no children in the halls,
Though there is no choir in the church to raise their voices in hymns and no congregation to lead in worship, to give praise to God together,
Though there be no sign of peace to exchange, and there is distance to be kept,
Though there is grave concern throughout the world,
Yet will I rejoice in the Lord and exult in my saving God.
God, my Lord, is my strength."

It is my hope that you will find comfort in scripture and cause for rejoicing in your faith in God who gave us his only begotten Son to show us the way and to be the light of the world.

#### **ARCHDIOCESAN DEACON FORMATION PROGRAM**

Permanent deacons are called to a special ministry of service through which they assist the poor, the hungry, the sick, the homeless, immigrants, and others. As ministers of God's Word, deacons proclaim the Gospel at Mass, preach, and teach. They also exercise various liturgical roles. including baptisms, witnessing marriages, and preside at funerals, wakes, and graveside services. The Office of Permanent Diaconate Formation of the Archdiocese of Washington will begin a new cycle of preparation of men for the diaconate in October 2020. The initial selection process for this class, a series of "Come and See" events around the Archdiocese, has been cancelled.
