



### **TOGETHER AT HOME**

(The following is an excerpt from Archbishop Wilton Gregory's "What I Have Seen and Heard" column from April 2 for the *Catholic Standard* newspaper and website of the Archdiocese of Washington.)

"[...] There are various other lessons to be captured during this moment of extended family time together.

The domestic Church is a phrase that we may have heard before, but in today's environment, we are challenged to discover that reality in a very personal way.

Our families must be re-introduced to praying together. Not just a few brief words at special meals, but sustained time for speaking to God together young and old, parents and children who now presume to speak to the Father of us all with a common voice as an expression of the church within the home. [...] Families have the opportunity to engage one another at levels that might have been unthinkable when we began Lent only a few weeks ago. There are still many possible distractions because of the omnipresent electronic gadgets upon which we too often have come to depend – adults and children alike. Meal times in sequestered family life might be the first opportunity for real conversation so put down the smart-phones. Shared chores and common projects might also be opportunities to rediscover the value to be found in each other. Hopefully, with prayer and a hefty amount of laughter, we will all survive this moment and learn to love God and one another more at its exit! "

### Easter Sunday of the Lord's Resurrection / YEAR A

### **ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Ps 139: 18, 5-6**

I have risen, and I am with you still, alleluia. You have laid your hand upon me, alleluia. Too wonderful for me, this knowledge, alleluia, alleluia.

### READING I: ACTS 10:34A, 37-43

Peter's sermon is a summary
of the early preaching of the Gospel
and a reminder that our faith depends solely
on the witness of those
"who ate and drank with [Jesus] after he rose from the dead."

### **PSALM RESPONSE: PS 118**

"This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad."
This individual song of thanksgiving becomes for us
Jesus' own celebration of the resurrection and our assurance
that the "rejected stone" of the crucified Christ has become
the "cornerstone" of our faith (Joel 2:12-18). In response
to a current calamity, the prophet calls for an act
of communal repentance. This reading describes
the ritual act itself as well as the prophet's sense,
in the final verse, that the Lord will hear the people's prayer.

### READING II: I COR 5:6B-8

Christ our Passover has been sacrificed!

Let us keep the feast.

This alternative second reading reminds us that the Eucharist is an Easter sacrament.

### **GOSPEL: JN 20:1-9**

IIn the Eastern Churches, Mary Magdalene is honored as the "witness to the resurrection and co-equal of the Apostles."

To her witness the Fourth Gospel adds the testimony of Peter and the beloved disciple.

### **COMMUNION ANTIPHON: LK 24: 34**

The Lord is truly risen, alleluia.

To him be glory and power
for all the ages of eternity, alleluia, alleluia.

including baptisms, witnessing marriages, and preside at funerals, wakes, and graveside services. ### **STEWARDSHIP**


Very early in the morning after the Sabbath,
