## **ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Ps 28: 8-9**

The Lord is the strength of his people, a saving refuge for the one he has anointed. Save your people, Lord, and bless your heritage, and govern them for ever.

## **READING I: JER 20:10-13**

Even though human friends turn away from the prophet, he still puts his trust in God, who stands with him "like a mighty champion."

## **PSALM RESPONSE: PS 69**

"Lord, in your great love, answer me." In its original context, this is an individual lament addressed to God by someone who has been unjustly accused of theft. The imagery of trial by ordeal and judgment meted out by the elders is mostly omitted in this edited version; what remains is an appeal to God for justice and an invitation to all who are unjustly accused to remember that "the LORD hears the poor."

## READING II: ROM 5:12-15

The Jewish people at Paul's time understood themselves as part of a family, clan, or a nation, not as individuals. Therefore, Adam's sin was not one person's sin but the sin of all. And, likewise, through one person, Jesus Christ, all have a share in his resurrection of the dead. Through God's mercy, this free gift of righteousness was given to all.

## GOSPEL: MT 10:26-33

In the Q parallel (Lk 12:8–9), the Son of Man will acknowledge those who have acknowledged Jesus, and those who deny him will be denied (by the Son of Man) before the angels of God at the judgment. Here Jesus and the Son of Man are identified, and the acknowledgment or denial will be before his heavenly Father.

## **BUILDING BRIDGES**

(The following, an except from a letter titled "Building Bridges of Understanding and Hope" from the Catholic bishops serving in the dioceses in Maryland, was issued on June 15 by the Maryland Catholic Conference. <u>Click here</u> to read the full letter.)

"For centuries, our country and our State have been plagued with problems of racial inequality and injustice. Although many people have acted in good faith in service and prayer to bring about just change, to acknowledge the dignity of each life, and to love one another, our current crisis causes us to reflect on how much we still must do together to make impactful progress. We vividly recall our own Church's past sins and failings and admit to them freely. with regret and humility, we must recognize that as Catholic leaders and as an institution we have, at times, not followed the Gospel to which we profess and have been too slow in correcting our shortcomings. For this reason, it is incumbent upon us to place ourselves at the forefront of efforts to remove the inequalities and discrimination that are still present in Maryland and our nation today. [...] We must recognize that all of us share the same human nature and dignity because we are all created in the image and likeness of God; this is why human life is sacred. [...] We must seek to know and understand one another and to work to break down barriers through listening, prayer and a commitment to change hearts and minds."


