The woman in Shunem goes out of her way to show hospitality to Elisha, far beyond what the normal rules of hospitality might suggest. In return, Elisha gives her and her husband the desire of their hearts.

PSALM RESPONSE: Ps 89

“Forever I will sing the goodness of the Lord.”
Based on what God has already done for the people, the psalmist looks to the future with hope, relying that God will not change but will fulfill the divine promises.

READING II: ROM 6:3-4, 8-11

An echo of the Easter Vigil, Paul reminds the community in Rome that they can hope for a share in Christ’s resurrection because they have gone into the water of baptism in order to share his death.

GOSPEL: MT 10:37-42

Jesus calls for an extreme commitment from his apostles. He also calls them to go beyond the normal bounds of hospitality in offering help to those who cannot repay.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: Ps 103:1

Bless the Lord, O my soul,
and all within me, his holy name.
