ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Ps 119: 137, 124

You are just, O Lord, and your judgement is right; treat your servant in accord with your merciful love.

READING I: Ez 33:7-9

Today's passage is part of a larger periscope describing the interrelatedness of people and the important role each one has in speaking truth, whether about virtue or wickedness, to each other. Certainly it is the role of a prophet, but for our communities we too are called to support and challenge each other in faith.

PSALM RESPONSE: PS 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9

"If today you hear God's voice, harden not your hearts"
Today we hear about conversion and reconciliation in the
community. We are called to release others and ourselves from
the burden of grudges. Reconciliation is not only with God, but
with each other.

READING II: ROM 13:8-10

Having already described his theology of law, righteousness and grace, Paul now becomes practical. It isn't about following the letter of the law, but rather simply to love one another. Where do we stand? Following laws, or living in love?

GOSPEL: MT 18:15-20

There will be sin and disagreement. However, the gospel view is not a standoff or encampment, but reconciliation. If the two can't do it on their own, then the community should mediate. Notice that if there is an irresolvable rift, the final answer is not retaliation but loving distance.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: Ps 42: 2-3

Like the deer that yearns for running streams, so my soul is yearning for you, my God; my soul is thirsting for God, the living God.

FOOD DRIVE

Hunger and food insecurity resulting from the coronavirus pandemic continue to affect many children and families in our community. Saint Martin's Cloak, SOME, and Bethesda Help are collaborating to sponsor a food drive to take place on Saturday, September 12, from 10:00 am to 12:00 noon, in the lower parking lot of St. Jane de Chantal Church. The food will benefit Bethesda Help, which serves neighbors in and around our parish; Catholic Charities of Montgomery County; and Shrine of the Sacred Heart, our sister parish in the District, where food insecurity is particularly acute. All three locations are in need of the following items for their pantries: grains (instant oatmeal, white and brown rice, macaroni and cheese, pasta), canned protein (tuna, chicken, salmon), canned fruit (peaches, pineapples, mandarin oranges), canned vegetables (beans, corn, mixed), other (canned spaghetti sauce—no glass jars—

Please note, we are not asking that you make a special trip to the store for these items, just that you add some items for us when you are at the grocery store or when you place an order. We don't want to expose anyone to additional risk! We will collect the food from you in a socially distanced manner: you may remain in your car, as someone with the proper protective clothing will collect your donation. 2020-2021 CCD

We are excited to open registrations for our CCD program for the coming year 2020-2021. You can expect major changes due to the restrictions currently in place. We regret that one such change is that the Faith of Our Toddlers program (FOOT) will not be able to be offered this year. We fully expect that program to resume in the future. Our plan is to have grades 1-8 meet in person once per month on Tuesday evenings from 5:30-6:45 pm in Caulfield Hall, and the Narthex or the lower level of church. Safety will be very much the priority and temperature checks will be done on adults and students before each class. Each student and adults will be required to wear a mask or face covering the entire time they are in the building. The students will be socially-distanced and only two classes will meet each week in separate spaces on a rotating basis (for example, grades 1 and 2 will meet on the the first Tuesday of the month, grades 3 and 4 will meet on the second Tuesday of the month, and so on). An email along with a detailed letter attached from the Office of Religious Education to all parents will be going out soon with many more specific details. Please visit the parish website to sign your children up for our Faith Formation program.

RELIGION TEACHERS

Adult volunteers (parents and others) are needed to teach religion to our parish children who attend public school. Volunteers are also needed assist with various protocols to ensure the safety of our children while they are here on campus. Experience is not necessary – training provided! 
