# **ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: SIRACH 36:18**

Give peace, O Lord, to those who wait for you, that your prophets be found true. Hear the prayers of your servant, and of your people Israel.

# **READING I: SIRACH 27:30—28:7**

The wisdom of today's passage cuts right to the core of lived faith. If we belief in forgiveness, mercy, love, then how can we deny these to our neighbor?

# PSALM RESPONSE: PSALM 103 1-2, 3-4, 9-10, 11-12

"The Lord is kind and merciful, slow to anger, and rich in compassion." In light of the periscope from Sirach, we sing about more than just fixing our sins with God, but also mirroring the Lord's compassion in our relationships with one another.

# **READING II: ROMANS 14:7-9**

There are different ways to live the gospel, yet all are rooted in the Lord. In all we do, we do it for the Lord. We are not to judge others or put stumbling blocks in their way of faith. How we praise God has a clear relationship to how we treat our sisters and brothers in love. "I give you a new commandment, says the Lord; love one another as I have loved you".

# **GOSPEL: MATTHEW 18:21-35**

In last week's passage we heard about Christ's presence where two or three are gathered. Immediately Peter, who always seems to struggle with Jesus' new vision of the world, asks about forgiveness of one's neighbor. He is shocked by the radical message he has heard. Yet, Jesus reiterates the requirement of forgiveness – seventy-seven times. He will go on to recount a parable about forgiveness. As God has forgiven us, therefore we too must forgive generously.

# VIRTUAL BIBLE STUDY: PAUL'S LETTER TO THE PHILIPPIANS

# 2020-2021 CCD

You can expect major changes due to the restrictions currently in place. We regret that one such change is that the Faith of Our Toddlers program (FOOT) will not be able to be offered this year. We fully expect that

program to resume in the future. Our plan is to have grades 1-8 meet in person once per month on Tuesday evenings from 5:30-6:45 pm in Caulfield Hall, and the Narthex or the lower level of church. Safety will be very much the priority and temperature checks will be done on adults and students before each class. Each student and adults will be required to wear a mask or face covering the entire time they are in the building. The students will be socially-distanced and only two classes will meet each week in separate spaces on a rotating basis (for example, grades 1 and 2 will meet on the first Tuesday of the month, grades 3 and 4 will meet on the second Tuesday of the month, and so on). Please visit the parish website to sign your children up for our Faith Formation programs.
