ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: ROMANS 485

I am the salvation of the people, says the Lord.

Should they cry to me in any distress, I will hear them, and I will be their Lord for ever

READING I: ISAIAH 55: 6-9

God's way is often not our way. The prophet beseeches us to align ourselves with God. Note that this passage is not a strong condemnation and call to conversion but rather a more gentle entreaty to return to and live in the Lord.

PSALM RESPONSE: PSALM 145: 2-3, 8-9, 17-18

"The Lord is near to all who call upon him."

READING II: PHILIPPIANS 1:20c - 24, 27A

Paul concludes that in both life and death we 'live' as Christians for Christ. We embrace each day in faith. How will this letter be heard in your community? Some parishioners, the elderly or those who are living with cancer, for example, may be struggling with life and death issues. Perhaps a song or intention is appropriate for them today.

GOSPEL: MATTHEW 20:1-16A

The parable is also a reflection on those who see themselves as having tried to live the Gospel well and for a long time. In some people's hearts, there is a sense of earning grace, mercy and God's love. Some Christian communities have developed a belief in 'real' Christians and lesser ones. This pericope is also a confrontation and condemnation of this type of thinking. All is gift. All belong equally in the Reign of God.

WELCOME: OUR NEW DIRECTOR OF MUSIC AND LITURGY

The parish is extremely pleased to welcome Dr. Giuliano Grisi to the Saint Jane de Chantal family as its new music and liturgy director. Dr. Grisi has an extraordinary background in music which will greatly enrich our parish worship and spirituality. Dr. Giuliano began his professional music career at the age of 15, collaborating as organist and conductor of many different choirs in Italy. He has a Ph.D. in Orchestra Conducting from the Conservatory of Music of Venice (Italy). He also earned a Master's degree in Choir Conducting and Organ at the Pontifical Institute of Sacred Music in Rome where he also worked as a teacher and choir conductor. His background also includes serving as the director of Music at the Pontifical Parish of St. Anna in Vatican City, serving as the organist and choir director of St. Marco Cathedral, Venice Italy, and organist at St. Maria Matricolare Cathedral in Verona. Dr. Grisi will relocate to the area in October and will be joined by his wife, Shiva, and son. Sebastian.

SUCCESSFUL FOOD DRIVE

At last Saturday's food drive, co-sponsored by Bethesda Help, SOME, and St. Martin's Cloak, the parishioners of St. Jane de Chantal brought in, via a seeming caravan of 94 cars, more than 2550 lbs of food—that's more than a metric ton! The generosity of the de Chantal community was so great that we had to add two more charities to receive the excess food we collected. Our five recipient organizations included Bethesda Help food pantry (located in our own parish neighborhood); Shrine of the Sacred Heart, our sister parish in the District; Catholic Charities of Montgomery County in Silver Spring; SOME on O Street NW; and Missionaries of Charity on Otis Street NE (order founded by Saint Mother Teresa). In addition, we received monetary donations of more than \$700, which will support parishioners in need of financial assistance with their rent and utilities. On behalf of our Pastor, Father Giese, the cosponsoring parish organizations, and the generous parish volunteers, we wish to thank the St. Jane de Chantal parish community for the compassion and concern they showed for others in our immediate community and beyond during this economically stressful pandemic. RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

Interested in learning more about the Catholic faith? Thinking about becoming a Catholic? Or, are you a Catholic who would like to prepare for confirmation? St. Jane de Chantal Church's RCIA program is designed with you in mind. RCIA presents the fundamental teachings of the Catholic faith and prepares people to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church at Easter. RCIA is intended both for inquirers and for those who desire to receive one or more of the sacraments of initiation-Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. RCIA meets weekly from early October through May. Sessions will be held either virtually (via Zoom) or in person, depending on Covid restrictions. This year's calendar of sessions, events, readings, and holidays will be available soon. We will be using Credo—a video and print resource developed by the Dominican Friars and Thomistic Institute for use in RCIA programs. Sessions include a mix of video and live presentations as well as time for discussion and questions. During the fall, the program will provide an overview of the Catholic faith and doctrine. This is a time of inquiry and exploration. Early in the new year, the focus shifts from inquiry to preparation for the sacraments at Easter. Request a **mail-in ballot** by Oct. 22. Vote in-person during the early voting period, Oct. 22-29, 2020. If you haven't registered to vote or aren't sure if you are registered, **check here**. The Maryland Catholic Conference election **webpage** also has key dates and links. The Conference has sent Congressional candidates a candidate survey and will post the results by October.
