All that you have done to us, O Lord, you have done with true judgment, for we have sinned against you and not obeyed your commandments. But give glory to your name and deal with us according to the bounty of your mercy

Since we have a responsibility for our sins, we also have the opportunity for conversion. We are not limited or bound by past decisions, but are continually free to repent and change our ways. Undergirding the passage is the sense of journey. Because we are not victims of destiny, we can continue to grow in faith and right judgement.

Paul is concerned about unity in his community. He is offering a balance to our first reading. We are not to act as individuals, but as members of a community. We are to avoid selfishness, but rather be concerned about others and their needs.

I know them, and they follow me." So who then are the two
sons? We are meant to hear themes of choices, responsibility for
one's sins and the opportunity for conversion of heart and
actions.

Remember your word to your servant, O Lord, by which you have given me hope. This is my comfort when I am brought low.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA)

Interested in learning more about the Catholic faith? Thinking about becoming a Catholic? Or, are you a Catholic who would like to prepare for confirmation? St. Jane de Chantal Church's RCIA program is designed with you in mind. RCIA presents the fundamental teachings of the Catholic faith and prepares people to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church at Easter. RCIA is intended both for inquirers and for those who desire to receive one or more of the sacraments of initiation-Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. RCIA meets weekly from early October through May. Sessions will be held either virtually (via Zoom) or in person, depending on Covid restrictions. This year's calendar of sessions, events, readings, and holidays will be available soon. We will be using Credo—a video and print resource developed by the Dominican Friars and Thomistic Institute for use in RCIA programs. Sessions include a mix of video and live presentations as well as time for discussion and questions. This fall, the program will provide an overview of the Catholic faith and doctrine. This is a time of inquiry and exploration. Early in the new year, the focus shifts from inquiry to preparation for the sacraments at Easter. Dr. Grisi will relocate to the area this October and will be joined by his wife, Shiva, and son, Sebastian.
