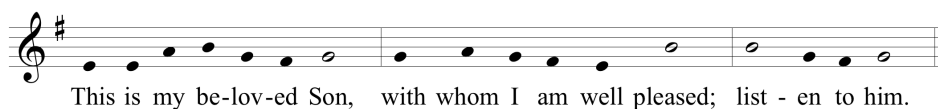

**MUSIC AND LITURGY NOTES**

Usually, in a Catholic church, you will find some sort of artwork or iconography marking the Fourteen Stations of the Cross. The Stations of the Cross began as a practice by pious pilgrims to Jerusalem who would retrace the final journey of Jesus Christ to Calvary, known as the *Via Dolorosa* (Way of Sorrows). Later, for the many who wanted to pass along the same route, but could not make the trip to Jerusalem, a practice developed that eventually took the form of the fourteen stations currently found in almost every church.

On Fridays during Lent, we, as a parish, pray the Stations of the Cross at 7:30 pm, however, on March 11, the Parish Youth will lead the Stations of the Cross, and on March 18 we will welcome a visiting organist from Paris, Mr. Thomas Ospital. Thomas is a brilliant and gifted young musician. He recently won the coveted position as Titular Organist at the Church of Saint Eustache in Paris. For the Stations on March 18th, we will show the silent film, "The Passion and Power of Christ," to which Thomas will accompany on the organ. The practice of accompanying silent films dates back to early twentieth century when films were first being produced. There was not yet the technology to add synchronized sound to the films, so oftentimes organs were built in theaters so that the film could be brought to life through musical accompaniment. This practice is still popular today, with many organists training in the craft of silent film improvised accompaniment. If you enjoy seeing films and enjoy music, then you'll really enjoy this event! And if you don't like the organ, give it a try. You'll hear the instrument in a completely different way. Either way, plan to be there; it will begin at 8pm.

For the past few weeks we have been experimenting with two alternative Masses featuring contemporary music. As I mentioned two weeks ago, in order for this music to be successful and to continue, we need your help as singers and instrumentalists. So far, we have no new instrumentalists or singers. If you know how to play a musical instrument or if you can sing, please consider joining our contemporary music ministry at the noon Mass (adults) or Sunday 5:00 pm Mass (teenagers). Contemporary church music needs more than one singer or instrumentalist.

**PHYSICIAN-ASSISTED SUICIDE LEGISLATION IN MARYLAND**

On January 29, legislation was introduced in the Maryland General Assembly that would legalize assisted suicide. Our Catholic faith teaches us that physician-assisted suicide gravely violates the sacred value of all human life, particularly of those who are vulnerable due to illness, age or disability, and undermines the medical profession's healing mission. This legislation is seriously flawed, unnecessary, and puts patients' lives at risk. It's impossible to accurately predict the progression of an illness in any particular patient. Yet, this bill would allow a patient to make a deadly decision based upon, at best, an educated guess! Additionally, no doctor, nurse, family member or independent witness is required to be present when the lethal dose is taken; patients will pick up their lethal prescriptions at their local pharmacies; and there is no requirement that patients receive a psychological evaluation before doctors can authorize physician assisted suicide. For these reasons, and others, a coalition of disability advocates, members of the medical community, patient advocates, and religious organizations, including the Maryland Catholic Conference, have joined together to lobby against these bills in Maryland. Your help is also needed. Our representatives in the Maryland General Assembly need to hear from you that you oppose this bill.
