MUSIC & LITURGY NOTES

Several months ago I wrote about a decision requested by the parish Pastoral Council for liturgical music “enhancements” at our weekend Masses. The first transition that was implemented involved offering alternative contemporary music at the Sunday 12:00 noon and 5:00 pm Masses. With every good intention, we experimented with this paradigm for four months. Following this period of time, it was determined that the Sunday 5:00 pm Mass will remain an alternative contemporary Mass and it is our hope that this contrasting liturgical style will continue to grow and foster participation at this Mass, which will be accompanied by the Family Choir and Instrumentalists. The Sunday 12:00 noon Mass will go back to the same style as the Saturday 5:00 pm Mass. The Sunday 10:00 am Mass will remain what some have dubbed as the “high Mass” of the parish, with the ministry of the Parish Choir. The next adjustment to be completed following the Pastoral Council’s request will now concern the Sunday 8:00 am Mass. In response to desire for a weekend Mass with a lighter program of music, the Sunday 8:00 am Mass will begin to implement a liturgy in the style of a “low Mass” starting next weekend. What is a “low Mass?” Traditionally, a low Mass was a Mass said without any music, however our 8:00 am Mass will retain music, but on a lesser scale, similar to the early Sunday morning liturgies offered at our neighboring parishes. There will be an opening hymn, followed by a recited Gloria and Psalm. The Gospel Acclamation refrain will be sung by all following an organ introduction, as well as a Sanctus and Agnus Dei. The Memorial Acclamation and Great Amen will be recited. The rest of the Mass (the offertory, communion, and concluding procession) will be accompanied by organ music. Because there will be no sung psalm or communion song, a cantor will not be scheduled to lead the music at this Mass, thus, it is up to the assembly to participate in the music, which will be familiar and simple. Teaching the congregation to find its voice will be the most rewarding goal of this new practice. For centuries before the existence of electricity, Catholics sang with great joy together without relying on a cantor to sing over them or for them. Truly, this practice has survived the test of time, and I promise that once you hear the voice your gathered assembly, worship will take on a more profound meaning. All other Masses will continue to rely on a cantor to lead the Psalm, Gospel Acclamation, and Communion Procession. Thank you for your patience and prayer while our parishes adjusts to this new style of liturgy. Our third and final response to the Pastoral Council’s request will come sometime next year and will involve the formation of a children’s music ministry to accompany the Sunday 12:00 noon Mass. Next to hearing your fellow worshippers singing, the voices of children singing is a wonderful manifestation of the Church alive in our parish.
