MUSIC & LITURGY NOTES

As many of you know, before arriving at St. Jane's nearly three years ago I had the honor of being the Associate Music Director at the National Shrine. Working at the Shrine was a faced paced job nearly comparable to working long hours as a lawyer at a top law firm or as a resident in an emergency room. It was a great opportunity though and I often reflect on my time there. One of the most demanding tasks placed upon me was to play daily Mass. There are six daily Masses at the Shrine, four of which have music. What made these Masses so special is the fact that the congregation led the music. With the exception of solemnities, there was no cantor at the daily Masses and so it was upon the assembly to sing the hymns and service music. I was astounded at the participation, especially coming from those gathered at the morning Masses (8am and 8:30... no time to stretch one's legs between those Masses). It gives not only the organist, but all who are assembled, great joy to worship within an actively engaged community. This summer, as we lead our Sunday 8am Mass from a cantor-led liturgy to a congregation-led liturgy, I pray that everyone can adopt a spirit of participation. The liturgy will be extremely "user-friendly." Here are some insights: The first hymn will be announced by the lector. We will sing two stanzas (or three if the text calls for it). The Gloria will be recited (the text is on the front inside cover of your hymnal). Use your hymnal to follow along with the readings and join in speaking the psalm response, which will be read by the first lector (since the psalm coincides with the first reading). For the Gospel Acclamation, the organ will play the melody once through, then the entire congregation is invited to join in singing. The priest or deacon may recite the verse, and if so, the congregation will repeat with another sung refrain. Offertory will be a time of personal prayer and reflection on the readings and homily. The Holy, Holy, Holy and Lamb of God will be sung to familiar settings. Please sing along with the organ, which, like the human voice of a cantor, can lead the melody. The Memorial Acclamation and Great Amen will be recited; please follow the priest, who will lead both. During the Communion distribution, there will be additional time for prayer and reflection, and after the final blessing and dismissal, the organ will play some music as the priest and ministers process out of the church. Please remain in your pew until the procession has ended. I assure you that this simpler style of liturgy will be no less prayerful, no less reverent, and no less engaging than our other liturgies. The most noticeable change might be the added periods of silence at various points during the Mass. The English novelist and philosopher, Aldous Huxley once wrote, "[it is] silence, that which comes nearest to expressing the inexpressible." Worship is the most important activity, the central focus of our Christian lives as individuals and our life together as people of God. No matter what the style of liturgy, we all play an important role in worship.


