MUSIC & LITURGY NOTES

Over the next few weeks, I will be writing about funeral liturgies. One of the more challenging aspects for me of working in the church is meeting with grieving families and friends to plan the funeral Mass of a loved one. It is difficult in many ways, first of which being that a lot of emotions are at play. Music schools do not teach their students how to work with people in distress, so I have had to learn this skill by observing others. For some, thinking about funeral arrangements might seem to be a macabre subject, but, through our faith, it is actually quite the opposite. If we have a good understanding of what our Church teaches, the funeral liturgy is an occasion of celebration. Meeting with a family to plan a funeral is not an ideal time to offer a lesson in liturgical catechesis, thus, over the next few weeks, I hope that you will allow me to offer my knowledge on the subject and to explain the Church's liturgical directives and teachings. A reminder about all liturgies and Masses — Christ is the focal point. It is through Christ and the Mass that we know God, love God, and serve God in this life and the next. Understanding that is a good place for us to start this discussion. (continued)

I will be away this week attending the biannual conference of the American Guild of Organists in Houston, Texas. The Guild is the largest national professional association serving church musicians. Their conferences usually attract over 2,000 church musicians from around the world. Throughout the four days, there are numerous workshops, liturgies, and concerts. Workshops are based on a variety of topics: organ playing, choral training, handbells, technology, fundraising, and administration to name a few. There are usually two liturgies a day offered in a number of denominational practices (I know many of you can think of a better way to spend your summer days other than going to church twice per day), and there are also numerous organ and choral concerts throughout the conference. It is not only an excellent learning experience, but it also inspires me in my service as a church musician, a profession which can easily lead some to burn out. One of the primary venues for the conference is the new co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart, with its vast interior space, superb acoustics, and world-class organ made by the Paul Fritts firm of Tacoma, Washington (you can watch videos of this instrument on YouTube). The Cardinal-Archbishop of Houston is a Pittsburgh priest (yes, we really are everywhere), Cardinal Dan DiNardo. Cardinal DiNardo sang in the Pittsburgh Diocesan Choir as a seminarian and has a profound respect for sacred music. When the architect of the cathedral made a mistake in the building of the west wall that left no space for a pipe organ, the Cardinal asked that the wall be taken down, redesigned and rebuilt so that an organ, the instrument of the Church, can be built. You don't hear about that happening too often. Another wonderful attribute of the co-Cathedral is that they sing my Mass setting, the Mass of Saint Ignatius, which we are also using for the Eucharistic Acclamations during the summer months. It is a wonderful thought that we worship with the same music as our fellow Catholics in the Lone Star State.
