MUSIC & LITURGY NOTES: FUNERALS (PART III)

In preparing the funeral liturgy, the family is invited to select the Scripture readings. The selection of passages from the Bible is an important part of planning a funeral liturgy, as we want to turn to God's word for wisdom and comfort in this time of loss. The Word of God is at the heart of our Christian celebration of faith in this funeral rite in anticipation of the resurrection of the body. We provide a number of suitable scripture passages appropriate for the occasion for the family to reflect upon and select.

Normally there are three readings: a reading from the Old Testament, a second reading from the New Testament, and finally, a Gospel reading. The readings proclaim to the assembly the paschal mystery, teach remembrance of the dead, convey the hope of being gathered together again in God's Kingdom, and encourage the witness of Christian life. The homily that follows the readings will reflect these pastoral elements in the context of the person's life. ►

The liturgy of the Word during funerals demands very careful preparation because the assembly present for the funeral may include some faithful who rarely attend the liturgy, and friends of the deceased who are not Christians. Most often, for the Responsorial Psalm, which follows the first reading, we will sing Psalm 23, "The Lord Is My Shepherd," because it is common to persons from a number of faith traditions, whether they practice their faith or not. This familiarity can create a sense of comfort among many who may unfortunately find the liturgy to be a foreign experience. Other psalm options are available, as well.

Up to three persons (practicing Catholics, preferably with lector experience) may be selected to read; one each for the first reading, second reading, and General Intercessions. The Gospel will always be proclaimed by a priest or deacon. The General Intercessions include five prayers commending our deceased loved one to God. If requested, the family can also add additional prayers and names to this list, as well. Given the understandable difficulty that family members likely will have maintaining their composure at the funeral, the parish is very happy to provide a lector.

Following the General Intercessions, just as at Sunday Mass, we are seated and enter into the Liturgy of the Eucharist, which we will discuss next week. ■

REFLECTION ON THE YEAR OF MERCY

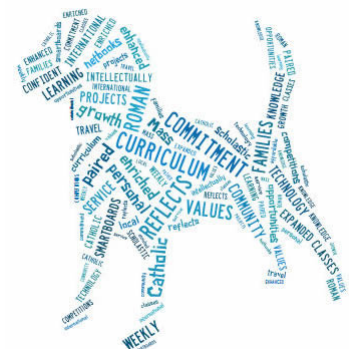

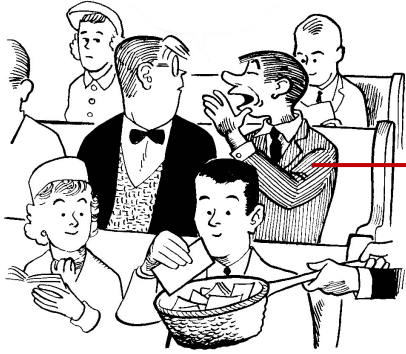
POOR BOX
