### MUSIC & LITURGY NOTES:

“Ask not what your country can do for you, ask what you can do for your country.” I often reflect on these words, made popular by President Kennedy during his 1961 Inauguration Address. While I strongly believe in their original sentiment, as delivered by President Kennedy, I also tend to apply the same philosophy to other aspects of life, as well. One of the aspirations of making this statement, no matter in what context, is the building of community. This being true, we could switch out the word “country” for “church.” “Ask not what your church can do for you, ask what you can do for your church.” I intend no irreverence to the late president’s address by recycling these words, but in terms of community building, it makes a great thought-provoking statement. While the fundamental exercise of our church involves what the church can do for us, namely in the celebration and reception of the sacraments, the building of community is a necessary ingredient for any church hoping to show witness of the faith and to evangelize others through the message of Jesus Christ. This is what we can offer to the church. ►

In this context of community building, I wish to highlight several opportunities for you to become involved in our church through liturgical and music ministries. Being involved in a church ministry shows not only your desire to deepen your commitment to Christ through the service of others, but also shares in your responsibility as a Christian to serve others by example. Throughout the next few weeks, I will highlight some of our ministries in the hopes that you will find an opportunity to become involved in our church. Liturgical and musical ministries are an art in the sense that art is an expression of one's self for the betterment of others. Why become involved in an art? I'll leave you with this quote from the famous musician and conductor, Leonard Bernstein, "The point is, art never stopped a war and never got anybody a job. That was never its function. Art cannot change events. But it can change people. It can affect people so that they are changed [...] because people are changed by art – enriched, ennobled, encouraged – they then act in a way that may affect the course of events [...] but the way they behave, the way they think." ■
