MUSIC & LITURGY NOTES:

The word "liturgy" is often defined as "the work of the people," but the word is also meant to encapsulate the meaning, "the service of the people." Liturgy is an umbrella term for any event, or ritual, which takes place participating in a divine act. The Mass is a liturgy; so also are the Liturgy of the Hours (i.e. Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer, Compline). When we come together for liturgy, we respond to our baptismal call to holiness, participating in Christ's life and mission so as to imitate him in thought, word, and action. One way to more fully express your faith through liturgy is to serve as a liturgical minister. The ministries of Usher, Lector, and Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion are vital to the mission of Saint Jane's Church. Each of these three ministries imparts Christ's presence among us. From the Eucharistic Minister who distributes the Body and Blood of Christ at Mass, to the Lector, who proclaims the Word of God, and to the Usher, who makes Christ present by welcoming us into a community.

Do you have a calling to become a liturgical minister? Yes, you do—every Christian person does. This fall, we would like to focus on recruiting more young adult participation in each of our liturgical ministries (although we continue to warmly and enthusiastically invite older adults and seniors to serve, as well). Young adults are of great importance to the future of the Church in the twenty-first century. Confirmed Catholics, ages 16 on up, to participate in a liturgical Ministry. Parents, please discuss this opportunity with your high school teenagers and encourage them to become involved in the life of our parish. Please see the bulletin for upcoming training sessions.

Many have commented on my interview in the *Washington Post* from last weekend. It is certainly an honor to have been included in a group of such talented musicians. My quote, however, was taken a little out of context. The writer had asked me why so many organists play at churches. I replied to him with my answer, which was then turned into my statement! Had I known, I would have worded that much differently. I didn't become an organist to perform on Carnegie Hall; I became an organist as a vocational calling to serve the Church through music. Also in my interview, you'll read about how I became interested in playing the organ through singing in my home church's children's choir. This is actually quite true. Being a member of the children's choir when I was in the fourth grade was a pivotal experience in my life. It is for that experience why I am here with you today. Anyone who has worked closely with me in ministry at St. Jane's knows that I am eager and anxious to start a parish children's choir. I have placed this ministry on the "back burner," waiting until we can raise funds to renovate a portion of the church basement into a choir rehearsal room; however, that project has, unfortunately, never quite gotten off the ground. I am interested in knowing if there are any families with children in grades 4-8 who would be interested in being part of a children's choir. My ultimate goal is to offer our parish youth not only a top tier professional musical education, but also to teach them about the Church, its liturgy, and how music functions as an essential tool for the evangelization of our faith from generation to generation. SECOND COLLECTION: MAINTENANCE


The second collection this weekend, August 6/7, is our monthly collection to help with the repair and maintenance of our parish facilities.
