MUSIC & LITURGY NOTES:

As we prepare to enter into a fresh season of Music Ministry this fall, I would like to encourage all of our parishioners to partake in making music at Saint Jane's as a way to add sonic splendor to our worship. We have openings for new members in the Parish Choir, especially men, as well as singers of all ages to join the Family Choir and Handbell Ensemble. New parishioners are especially welcome to join a music ministry, as this provides an excellent opportunity to become involved in our parish and to meet fellow parishioners. I would like to debunk several of the "myths" of our music ministry:

"I don't have time." I understand that your time is valuable, which is why I ask of the minimum amount possible for each ensemble. The Parish choir is a commitment of 3.75 hours per week (a two-hour Thursday rehearsal and Sunday Mass with a 45 minute warm-up), while the Family Choir is a commitment of two hours per week (4:00 pm Sunday rehearsal before 5:00 pm Sunday Mass), and the Handbell Ensemble is a ►

commitment of one hour per week (Thursday rehearsal) plus an additional 2 hours when we are scheduled to ring at a Mass, which happens roughly once per month. If that is still too much time for you to offer, then there are other ways for you to participate, as well, such as playing an instrument with the Family Choir at the Sunday 5pm Mass.

"I don't read music." That's ok. We will teach you some of the basics of reading music. Choir members who are veterans are learning along with you and their sound will carry you at first.

"I don't know anyone in the choir." That's one good reason to join! Make some new friends and see how worship works from the other side of the pews. All of our ensembles are warm and welcoming and we promise to make you feel right at home in no time.

"I can't sing." Yes, you can. And, if you happen to sing like Florence Foster Jenkins, then allow me the opportunity to help you to grow and develop your voice into something that you are proud of to share with others.

By being a member of our Music Ministry, you will help us to revitalize an important part of our parish liturgical life, and, in the process you will reap additional graces in your own spirituality and faith formation. 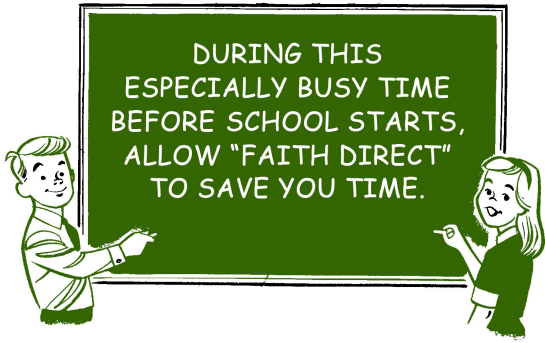
STEWARDSHIP
