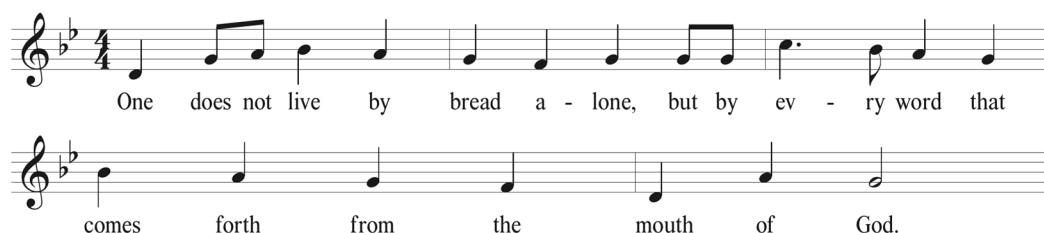

MUSIC & LITURGY NOTES:

Why is it that you can go to any church in the world on a given Sunday and hear the same scripture readings, but sing different music?

I have two bookcases in my office; one is filled with books on liturgy and the other is filled with books on music. Each are at about maximum capacity. Included in the liturgy books are various documents on our faith and liturgical rituals published from all three “branches” of the Church: the Vatican, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, and the Archdiocese of Washington. Of these documents, I find the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* to be the most useful. This book teaches us the how, what, and why of the Holy Mass, and includes many references to the music that accompanies our sacred worship. The Church, being universal, has published texts to be sung at every Mass throughout the world on any given day. These texts, known as “Antiphons,” are placed at the Introit (Entrance), Offertory, and Communion. While the Church’s preferred option is to sing these prescribed antiphons (their text compliment the scriptural themes of the day), another option is permitted that allows us to replace them with other songs common to a local culture. Most clergy and music directors will choose this option since the practice of singing the antiphons fell largely out of practice in North America following the Second Vatican Council. By selecting this option, it is up to an individual, not the Church, to select the music for a particular Mass. While it is hoped that some thought will go into this process and that the music selected will complement the scripture, sadly that is often not the case in many of our churches and this has led to a disconnect between music and liturgy which many, including myself, are working to restore.

During the holy seasons of Advent and Lent, we sing the proper Communion Antiphon at each Sunday liturgy. These are settings of the text found in the *Roman Missal* with an accompanying psalm found in the *Graduale Romanum*, one of the Church’s earliest musical sources. It is my sincere hope that these refrains, sung with the Church Universal, will assist you in finding a deeper meaning in each of our Sunday liturgies during the Lenten season.
