LENT IN OUR PARISH

MUSIC AND LITURGY NOTES

All four Gospels include the Passion narrative, but it is interesting to note that only the Gospels of Mark and Matthew, which we hear in this year's Lectionary cycle, mention the fact that Jesus began his journey to the cross in song ("Then, after singing a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives" Mt. 26:30). In our worship, let us strive to connect with Christ during his Passion, Death, and Resurrection by following his example and marking this important journey in song.

Everyone is encouraged to attend the Paschal Triduum liturgies (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday), especially the Easter Vigil; not only is it filled with beautiful ancient ritual, you won't need to worry about finding a parking space or a pew! Though the Triduum is chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day—unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence: only one full meal for those age 18-59, and no meat for those age 14 and above.

We encounter Jesus this week in Jerusalem, a community he knew well. We prayerfully enter into our own communities too, encountering those who are hungry and thirsty, and others who need our help.
