2017 LEGISLATIVE SESSION SUMMARY

The 437th legislative session of the Maryland General Assembly ended on Monday, April 10, after 90 days where more than 2,800 bills were introduced. The legislature approved nearly 950 measures. The Maryland Catholic Conference advocates the Church's public policy positions for the more than 1 million Catholics living in the state. Many of the major initiatives addressed by the Conference during the 2017 legislative session resulted in a successful outcome.
