LADIES OF CHARITY

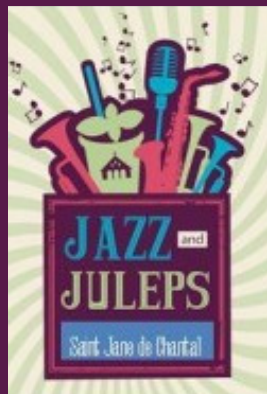
