CHARLES O'HARA HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

Rock Creek Council is renewing the Charles O'Hara Scholarship Program for the 2017-2018 school year. Up to three scholarships may be granted for \$1,500 each to eighth grade students entering a Catholic high school in the Archdiocese of Washington. The scholarships are renewable for up to four years. Applicants will be judged on the basis of academic achievement, personal qualifications, merit, and involvement in council, church, and community activities. Current third degree members in good standing of Rock Creek Council will be given a 5-point preference and third degree insurance members a 10-point preference. Children of deceased members in good standing at the time of their death are also eligible. Non-members may apply if their father is eligible and willing to join Rock Creek Council. Scholarships awarded to non-members will be for one year, unless their father becomes a third degree insurance member of Rock Creek Council before the time for renewal.
