MUSIC AND LITURGY NOTES

According to the Liturgical Calendar, weeks that fall outside the solemn seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter are known as "Ordinary Time." In Latin, these weeks are called *Tempus per annum*, which is roughly translated as "time during the year." There are some Sundays that fall on Solemnities, and those days are given a special title (such as last week's celebration of Corpus Christi), but the weekdays of those weeks are according to Ordinary Time. I hesitate to publically offer my opinion, but allow me to just say that I struggle with the word "ordinary." There is nothing ordinary about these weeks! Quite the contrary, these are the weeks in which we ►

learn most about the life of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, outside of his birth, passion, death, and resurrection. In fact, these weeks are especially extraordinary.

If one was to look up the word ordinary in the thesaurus, it could be viewed as synonymous with words like “typical,” “mundane,” “routine,” or even “boring.” How unfortunate! These are the weeks when we learn the most about Jesus and his ministry, and these are the weeks when we come to understand the principals upon which he built his Church – the very same Church that we are now a part of. The weeks of ordinary time guide us on our faith journey. Each of these weeks brings us closer to Christ, who, as stated in Apostle Paul’s letter to the Colossians, will lead us to Kingdom of God our Father. What a joy it is that we are able to celebrate in this Truth! May God bless you during these weeks of extraordinary time! ■



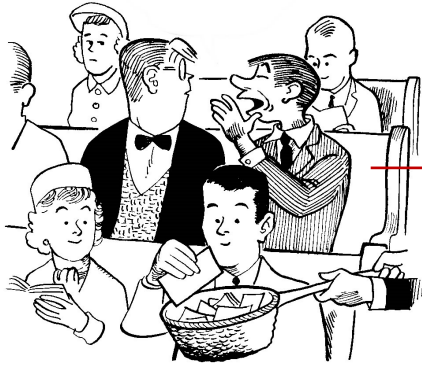
