**MUSIC AND LITURGY NOTES**

Today's Gospel reminds me of a quote from Saint Basil the Great that I recently came across: "The Holy Spirit sees how much difficulty mankind has in loving virtue; how we prefer the lure of pleasure to the straight and narrow path. What does He do? He adds the grace of music to the truth of doctrine. Charmed by what we hear, we pluck the fruit of the words without realizing it." Just as Jesus spoke to the crowd in today's Gospel through parable, we sing in Church as a means of gradual comprehension and acceptance of our faith in Christ. The songs that we sing draw us not to listen but rather to participate. Singing in church is a sacred discipline and an omnipresent theme in holy Scripture. We sing because we are called to sing. We sing because it adds dimension to the sacred work of the liturgy. And as we sing, God sings with us and through us, transforming us into his likeness.

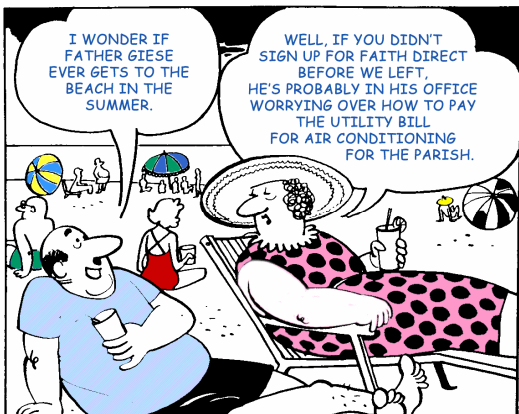
**Cost for tree removal and equipment replacement: \$7,400**

This is especially important in the summer months,

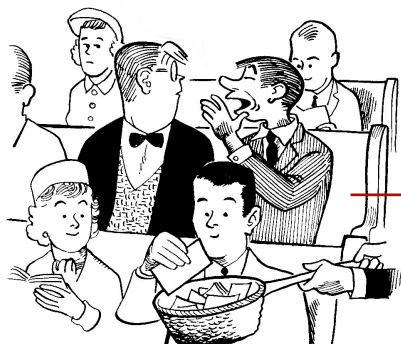
when families may be out of town
