"There is a nobility in the duty to care for creation through little daily actions, and it is wonderful how education can bring about real changes in lifestyle" (*Laudato si'* 211). This week's tip: Use the microwave, small electric pans, toaster ovens or convection ovens for meals rather than your stove or oven. You'll use about one-third to one-half as much energy. Use appliances that are certified safe by the UL (formerly Underwriters Laboratories) or another OSHA approved safety testing organization and appliances that have a high Energy Star efficiency rating.

FATHER VINCENT CAPODANNO MEMORIAL MASS

A Memorial Mass for Father Vincent R. Capodanno, MM, will take place on Tuesday, September 5 at 6:30 pm in the Crypt Church of the Basilica of the National Shrine (400 Michigan Ave., NE). Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio of the Archdiocese for the Military Services will be the main celebrant. This annual Mass is celebrated in memory of Father Capodanno, killed in Vietnam on September 4, 1967 as he aided embattled Marines. Father Capodanno posthumously received the Medal of Honor, and in May 2006, the Catholic Church officially proclaimed him a Servant of God, formally initiating his cause for canonization.
