MEMORIAL MASS FOR BLESSED FR. VINCENT CAPODANNO

A 50th Anniversary Memorial Mass for Father Vincent R. Capodanno, MM, will take place on Tuesday, September 5 at 6:30 pm in the Crypt Church of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception (400 Michigan Ave., NE). Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio of the Archdiocese for the Military Services will be the main celebrant. This annual Mass is celebrated in memory of Father Capodanno, killed in Vietnam on September 4, 1967 as he aided embattled Marines. In May 2006, the Catholic Church officially proclaimed him a Servant of God, formally initiating his cause for canonization. MASS FOR VENERABLE MSGR. ALOYSIUS SCHWARTZ

A Mass commemorating the life of Venerable Msgr. Aloysius Schwartz will be held on Saturday, September 16, at 5:00 pm at St. Andrew Apostle Church (11600 Kemp Mill Rd., Silver Spring). Cardinal Wuerl will be the principal celebrant and homilist. Aloysius Schwartz was born in Washington, DC in 1930, and attended Holy Name Church and School. He was ordained to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Washington in 1957, and began mission work in the Diocese of Busan, South Korea, just six months after ordination. Schwartz died on March 16, 1992, three years after being diagnosed with ALS. On January, 22, 2015, Pope Francis authorized the Congregation for the Causes of Saints to declare Fr. Aloysius Schwartz 'Venerable'—a title given to those who lived a life of heroic virtue and the next step to sainthood. He is the first person from the Archdiocese of Washington to receive this title.
