

MUSIC & LITURGY NOTES

*"There is the Music of Heaven in all things
and we have forgotten how to hear it until we sing."*

– St. Hildegard of Bingen

Music has accompanied the human experience since the dawn of recorded history and its value to life is no less significant today than it has been throughout centuries. It is an activity most successful when accomplished as a group. Group participatory activities demonstrate a powerful ability to bring together people of different backgrounds and walks of life, and unite them in a common goal. Just as many of us may participate in sports or social activities, music is no exception, and in fact, one can argue that it reigns supreme in its collaborative methods because groups engaged in making music focus their voices, talents, and skills into one collective sound formed by the universal musical language that is known on all continents and in all parts of the world. In church music, our common goal is to offer praise to God and to inspire the hearts, minds, and souls of our fellow parishioners. Church music is just as important at the parish level as it is at the most visible level at St. Peter's in Rome. For when we celebrate Mass together, we join with the universal Church as part of the Holy See and as a result, our celebrations are no less holy and divine as those celebrated elsewhere.

This all sounds pretty heavy, I know, but, I am attempting to create a "larger than life" picture of why music is so important. Beyond tying us together at the parish level, it unites us at the universal level, as well. Music seeks to create harmony among us and offers our collective ministry as an oblation to the Divine. With his lofty explanation, I wish to invite any of you reading this to consider joining our Music Ministry at St. Jane's. We are entering the second half of our ministerial season and are in need of new members, especially in the Parish Choir and in the Cantor Guild. I ask that volunteers in the cantor ministry have a basic knowledge of reading music, while for volunteers in the Parish Choir, music reading skills are helpful, but not essential. However, prior choral singing experience does help a bit. Beyond these two ministries, our Family choir continues to flourish under its new director, Ms. Patrice Roe, and our Handbell Ensemble is now ringing at full capacity.

Music Ministry does require a time commitment: a weekly rehearsal for the parish choir and independent rehearsal for cantors. This time of preparation is intended to be both prayerful and practical. I often say that we live in an age of unreasonable musical expectations. Television and media give the illusion that musical performance is something that can be flawless and spontaneous, yet in reality, our music ministers work hard both inside and outside of rehearsal to offer their best in praise of God and in service to others. Attention CPAs and Tax Lawyers

This upcoming tax return season, Catholic Charities is managing an IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program at Catholic University's Columbus School of Law. CPAs and tax lawyers are needed to provide *pro bono* tax preparation for the working poor. If a return is filed, many of these workers will enjoy a sizeable IRS refund check due in large part to the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC). The EITC can help lift thousands of Washington area families out of poverty and keeps them out of poverty. Sadly, almost 20,000 low income residents of DC are not claiming the EITC, and thus are losing a potential financial resource for them. Training will be provided in January for all interested volunteers. Tax return preparation will take place on Saturdays from February 3 to April 14.
