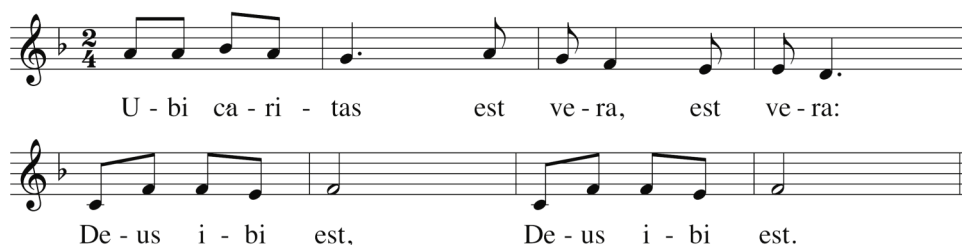

BOOST SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The State of Maryland BOOST Scholarship Program, which assists families with Catholic school tuition, is funded for a third year, at an increased level of \$7.6 million for the upcoming 2018-19 school year. There will be hundreds of new scholarships awarded. If you or someone you know is looking to enroll their public school student in a Catholic school, it is important to note that every student who sought transfer from a public school last year was offered a scholarship. Applications for the 2018-2019 school year are now open. Awards are granted based on household income, with the lowest income served first.
