Solemnity of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist

Entrance Antiphon

(Vigil Mass) He will be great in the sight of the Lord and will be filled with the Holy Spirit, even from his mother's womb; and many will rejoice at his birth. (Lk 1:15, 14)

(Mass during the Day) A man was sent from God, whose name was John. He came to testify to the light, to prepare a people fit for the Lord. (Jn 1:6-7; Lk 1:17)

(Sun. 5 pm) Ye Watchers and Ye Holy Ones#886 (Sun. 5 pm) from Mass of Creation#323 Reading IVigil: Jeremiah 1:4-10 / Day: Isaiah 49:1-6

(Vigil Mass) The story of the prophet Jeremiah's call to both destroy and build corresponds with the two sides of John the Baptists' message. Israel must flee from the wrath to come, even as they are promised the coming of Christ.

(Mass during the Day) The "Songs of the Servant" describe a figure who may be a future prophet or the nation itself. This second Servant Song is being applied to John the Baptist, whereas the servant of Isaiah is more commonly associated with our Lord.

(Vigil Mass) John the Baptist sums up the entire message of the Old Testament prophets just as the message on the birth of Christ is fulfilled.

> (Mass during the Day) A retelling of salvation history that is unique in its inclusion of Jesus's forerunner, John the Baptist.

(Sun. 5 pm) Celtic Alleluia.....#333

(Vigil Mass) The annunciation of John the Baptist's birth conveys the role that John will play in salvation history.

(Mass during the Day) A telling of the birth, circumcision, naming, and presentation of John the Baptist situates John as a turning point in salvation history, a manifestation of God's mercy.

TOUR THE MOCO RESOURCE RECOVERY FACILITY

The St. Jane Frances de Chantal Environmental Committee invites any interested adult to join in a tour of the Resource Recovery Facility and Composting Facility in Dickerson, Maryland, on Thursday, July 19. Leave from the St. Jane parking lot at 8:45 am, or meet at the Dickerson facility. The Resource Recovery Facility tour will begin at 10:00 am, and lasts approximately 1.5 hours; the Composting Facility, begins at 1:00 pm, and runs approximately 30 minutes. Bring a lunch for the break between tours. For more information and/or to reserve a spot on the tour, call Maureen Wilkerson at 240-432-5752. This tour can only accommodate 30 people. The Resource Recovery Facility processes over 1,500 tons of solid waste daily and provides up to 55 megawatts of energy daily which is enough power to fuel 40,000 homes. 2018-2019 HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH MINISTRY REGISTRATION

High School Teen Ministry is a great way for our teens to stay in contact with friends they have made while at St. Jane's School or CCD, as well as to stay connected to the parish. High School Youth Ministry is not CCD for high schools students. While there are times we focus on a particular topic of faith and life, everything we do is to help the students grow in their faith and live it out, through things like social activities, service opportunities, parish involvement, and retreats. High School Teen Ministry meets about three times a month, mostly on Sundays from 6:00-8:00 pm, with an occasional outing outside of that time.
