This Wednesday, July 4, is Independence Day, a federal holiday. The only Mass at St. Jane will be celebrated at 8:00 am. The parish office will be closed.


ST. MARTIN'S CLOAK SUMMER SOAP AND SHAMPOO DRIVE

The Resource Recovery Facility processes over 1,500 tons of solid waste daily and provides up to 55 megawatts of energy daily which is enough power to fuel 40,000 homes.
