TOUR THE MOCO RESOURCE RECOVERY FACILITY

The St. Jane Frances de Chantal Environmental Committee invites any interested adult to join in a tour of the Resource Recovery Facility and Composting Facility in Dickerson, Maryland, on Thursday, July 19. Leave from the St. Jane parking lot at 8:45 am, or meet at the Dickerson facility. The

Resource Recovery Facility tour will begin at 10:00 am, and lasts approximately 1.5 hours; the Composting Facility, begins at 1:00 pm, and runs approximately 30 minutes. Bring a lunch for the break between tours. For more information and/or to reserve a spot on the tour, call Maureen Wilkerson at 240-432-5752. This tour can only accommodate 30 people. The Resource Recovery Facility processes over 1,500 tons of solid waste daily and provides up to 55 megawatts of energy daily which is enough power to fuel 40,000 homes. 2018-2019 HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH MINISTRY REGISTRATION

High School Teen Ministry is a great way for our teens to stay in contact with friends they have made while at St. Jane's School or CCD, as well as to stay connected to the parish. High School Youth Ministry is not CCD for high schools students. While there are times we focus on a particular topic of faith and life, everything we do is to help the students grow in their faith and live it out, through things like social activities, service opportunities, parish involvement, and retreats. High School Teen Ministry meets about three times a month, mostly on Sundays from 6:00-8:00 pm, with an occasional outing outside of that time.
