Statement from the  
Archdiocese of Washington



*Sometime ago, an allegation that falls under the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People was made against Cardinal McCarrick when he served as a priest in the Archdiocese of New York. The Holy See, which has exclusive authority in the oversight of a cardinal, delegated Cardinal Timothy Dolan of New York to investigate the allegation, engaging the review board of the Archdiocese of New York. In the end the review board found the allegations credible and substantiated. The Vatican Secretary of State, Cardinal Pietro Parolin, at the direction of our Holy Father, Pope Francis, has instructed Cardinal McCarrick that he is to refrain from any public ministry or activity until a definite decision is made. Cardinal McCarrick, while maintaining his innocence, has accepted the decision.*

*While saddened and shocked, this archdiocese awaits the final outcome of the canonical process and in the meantime asks for prayers for all involved. At the same time, we renew our commitment to care for the victims who have suffered abuse, to prevent abuse before it occurs, and to identify and report child abuse once it has happened.*

### 2018-2019 HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH MINISTRY REGISTRATION

High School Teen Ministry is a great way for our teens to stay in contact with friends they have made while at St. Jane's School or CCD, as well as to stay connected to the parish. High School Youth Ministry is not CCD for high schools students. While there are times we focus on a particular topic of faith and life, everything we do is to help the students grow in their faith and live it out, through things like social activities, service opportunities, parish involvement, and retreats. High School Teen Ministry meets about three times a month, mostly on Sundays from 6:00-8:00 pm, with an occasional outing outside of that time. POPE FRANCIS

The Lord gave power to the Twelve: “the power to cast out impure spirits, to liberate, to heal. This is the power that Jesus gives.” This power coincides with “the mission of the Church: the Church which heals, which cures.” Pope Francis has spoken “a few times of the Church as a field hospital: it’s true! How many wounded there are, how many wounded! How many people who need their wounds to be healed!”

The Lord gave the Twelve the power with “plain advice: go into the community, but do not take anything for the journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money... in poverty!” The Gospel “is so very rich and so powerful that it does not need to create large firms, big companies, in order to be proclaimed;” it “should be proclaimed in poverty, and a real pastor is one who goes like Jesus: poor, to proclaim the Gospel, with that power. When the Gospel is safeguarded with this simplicity, with this poverty, one clearly sees that salvation is not a theology of prosperity,” but rather “a gift, the same gift that Jesus had received in order to give.”
