Reading I Joshua 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b

In the meeting at Shechem, Joshua calls on the people to renew the covenant once they have taken possession of the Promised Land. Every time the covenant is renewed, the people have a choice:

"If it does not please you to serve the Lord, decide today whom you will serve."

For us, the Eucharist is a time of covenant renewal that charges us to make the same choice.

Psalm 34 is the traditional Communion song, first used that way early in the Church's Eucharistic history. It was originally an individual thanksgiving addressed to the God whose eyes "are on the righteous and his ears open to their cry." It is also used as a common responsorial psalm for Ordinary Time.

Reading II Ephesians 5:21-32

Paul begins by affirming the normal legal relationship in a marriage:

Wives were, in fact, considered legally subordinate to their husbands in most things.

So he calls on the Ephesians, first, to obey the law. But then he invites them to go beyond it, into a covenant of love, just as Christ went beyond the legalities of the covenant to give himself in love for the sake of the Church.

2018-2019 HIGH SCHOOL YOUTH MINISTRY REGISTRATION

High School Teen Ministry is a great way for our teens to stay in contact with friends they have made while at St. Jane's School or CCD, as well as to stay connected to the parish. High School Youth Ministry is not CCD for high schools students. While there are times we focus on a particular topic of faith and life, everything we do is to help the students grow in their faith and live it out, through things like social activities, service opportunities, parish involvement, and retreats. High School Teen Ministry meets about three times a month, mostly on Sundays from 6:00-8:00 pm, with an occasional outing outside of that time. CCD TEACHERS, CO-TEACHERS, & DOOR/HALL MONITORS

CCD teachers are needed in grades K, 1, and 6; co-teachers/aides are needed in grades 1-8 for next year. Three door/hall monitors are also needed. These are vital ministries in the parish so that our young people can learn and grow in their faith. You do not need to have teaching experience to teach the faith, only a love of the faith and a love of being with children. Training and help will be given with materials to use, in-service, as well as a guidebook on planning lessons. The Virtus child protection background check, which can be completed in the summer, must be completed before volunteering can begin. 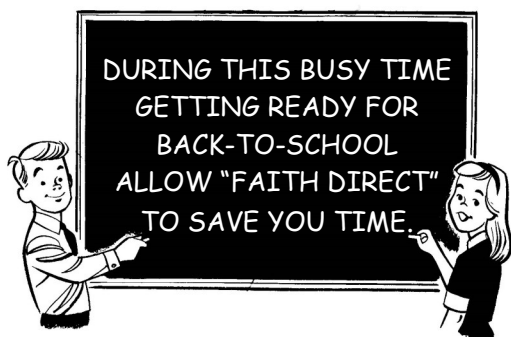
SECOND COLLECTION: CATHOLIC UNIVERSITY OF AMERICA
