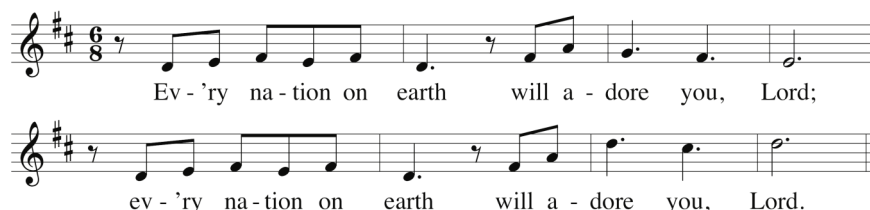

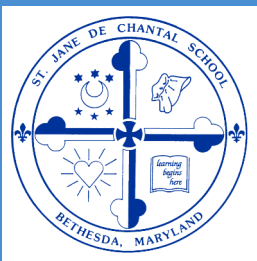
### QUO VADIS SHADOW DAY

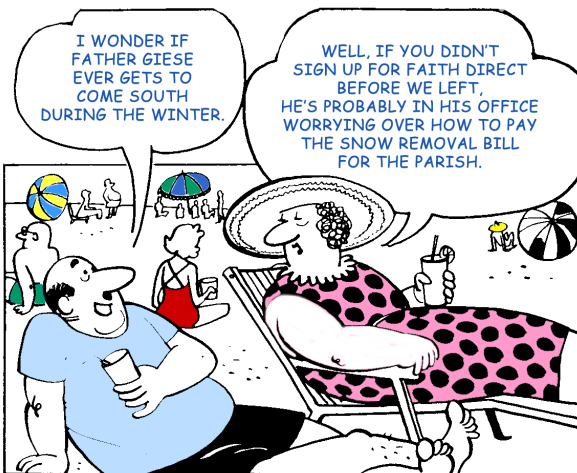
