This announcement is what makes it possible for most of us to be Christian: God's plan is that "the Gentiles are coheirs [with the Jews], members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus."

GOSPEL: MT 2:1-12

The story of the "magi from the east" puts in graphic form the Christian belief that the meaning of Christmas is for the nations. It also shows how the presence of Christ causes division: It makes some people fearful; it leads others to rejoice. The tradition that there were three magi comes from the fact that there are three gifts.

The brightness of God illumined the holy city Jerusalem, and the nations will walk by its light. **DURING THE DAY: MT 2:2** We have seen his star in the East, and have come with gifts to adore the Lord.
