Sixth grade placed 15th in the country out of 82 schools, and seventh grade placed 16th in the country out of 61 schools. Johnny Broome is 22nd in the country out of over 1,400 sixth graders; Ali Gandolfo is 69th in the country out of over 900 third graders; and Jessica Khoury is 56th in the country out of 900+ seventh graders.
