We are introduced this Sunday

Luke will interpret the Christian message
for us through the rest of this year.

This passage combine's the
opening verses with a description of
Jesus' announcement of his ministry
in the synagogue at Nazareth:
"Today this Scripture passage
is fulfilled in your hearing."

POPE FRANCIS

"In today's Gospel, before presenting Jesus' programmatic speech in Nazareth, Luke the Evangelist briefly recounts the work of evangelization. His Word is original because it reveals the meaning of the Scriptures. Jesus is different from the teachers of his time. For example, he doesn't open a law school but rather goes around preaching and teaching everywhere: in the synagogues, on the streets, in houses, always moving about! Jesus is also different from John the Baptist, who proclaims God's imminent judgment. Instead Jesus announces God's fatherly forgiveness. "
