His announcement is not received well.

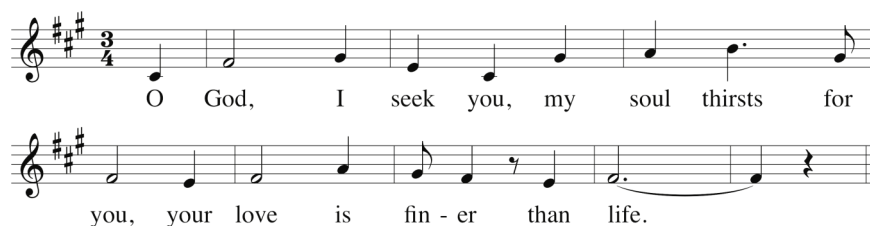

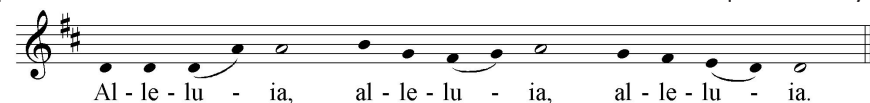

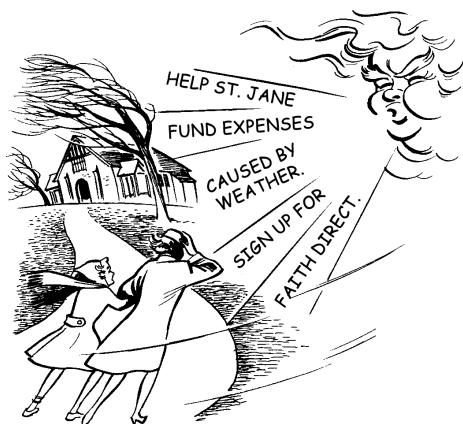
