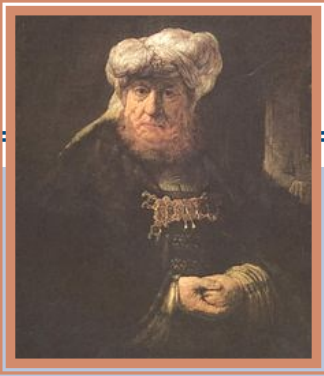

After a demonstration of

Jesus calls Simon (Peter), James, and
John to become fishers of men [people].

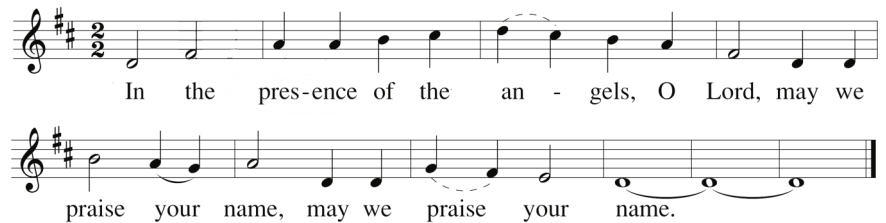

MARYLAND AGAINST PHYSICIAN ASSISTED SUICIDE

For the fourth time in five years, the Oregon-based special interest group Compassion and Choices is pushing to legalize physician-assisted suicide (PAS) in Maryland, and the Maryland Catholic Conference is joining with its coalition partners to strongly oppose the legislation. The Conference is a long-time member of the Maryland Against Physician Assisted Suicide (MAPAS) Coalition. Titled the "End-of-Life Option Act" (HB 399/SB 311), the bill was introduced at the beginning of February in both chambers of the Maryland General Assembly and is nearly identical to legislation rejected in 2015, 2016 and 2017 by Maryland lawmakers. Hearings have been scheduled for Friday, February 15 in the House, and Tuesday, February 19 at in the Senate.
