#### **ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: PS 91:15-16**

When he calls on me, I will answer him; I will deliver him and give him glory, I will grant him length of days.

#### **READING I: DT 26:4-10**

A description of ritual covenant renewal set in the Temple but put on the lips of Moses.

#### **PSALM RESPONSE: 91**

This psalm is a prayer of someone who has taken refuge in the Lord, possibly within the Temple.

The psalmist is confident that God's presence will protect the people in every dangerous situation; "the shadow of the Almighty," is an image of the safety afforded by the outstretched wings of the cherubim in the holy of holies.

## **READING II: ROM 10:8-13**

One of Paul's major points in this letter is that justification comes from faith in Jesus Christ. He makes that point by evoking a quote from the Scriptures to illustrate how believers must be wholeheartedly committed to Jesus and express that faith in their lives. This faith breaks down all barriers: "The same Lord is Lord of all."

#### GOSPEL: LK 4:1-13

The story of Jesus' temptation in the desert is always the Gospel for the First Sunday of Lent.
Its point is twofold:
He was tempted as we are, but he remained faithful to God despite temptation.

#### **FASTING & ABSTINENCE**

All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence for those age 14 and above. On weekdays during Lent, there is no obligation to fast, however, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended.

#### **EUCHARISTIC ADORATION**

"Carpooling with Christ," a holy hour with Eucharistic Adoration, will take place each Wednesday of Lent from 2:00 – 2:45 pm in the church. Adoration will also take place from 6:45 – 8:00 pm during confessions on Wednesdays. All are welcome to come in for a few minutes of prayer, or to stay the entire time!

#### CONFESSIONS

This Lenten season, each Catholic parish in the Archdiocese of Washington will have confessions available every Wednesday evening (except Ash Wednesday) from 6:45-8:00 pm. If you have been reluctant to come to the sacrament, have been away for some time or just found it difficult to get to a Saturday afternoon confession time, this is a wonderful opportunity to reconnect with Christ and His Church. ## MARYLAND ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL ADVANCES

For the first time ever, Maryland's full House of Delegates will take up the dangerous physician-assisted suicide bill, despite strong opposition. In a narrow 24-20 vote, the House Health and Government Operations and the House Judiciary committees voted on March 1 to send HB 399, the "End of Life Options Act," to the full House floor for a vote. As of the printing of this bulletin, the bill had not been scheduled for a vote. The Senate is currently considering its own version of the bill, SB 311, but the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee has yet to schedule it for a committee vote. There is still time to stop this dangerous bill from passing and protect life in Maryland. The Maryland Catholic Conference has made it easy to speak up and tell

your delegates that you stand firmly against assisted suicide. The Conference is asking all people who oppose this dangerous practice, which would put our most vulnerable at grave risk, to write their lawmakers now and ask them to vote "no" when HB 399 comes to the House floor. As a voter, your voice matters and HB 399 still can be stopped, but only if you make your opposition heard. Visit www.mdcatholic.org/pas\_2019\_act\_now to take action now.

## SECOND COLLECTION: CHURCH IN THE DEVELOPING WORLD


