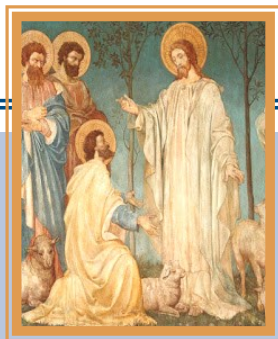


THE ORDER OF WORSHIP FOR THE THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER / YEAR C



Readings in *Worship* hymnal at #1084

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Ps 66:1-2

Cry out with joy to God, all the earth;
O sing to the glory of his name.
O render him glorious praise, alleluia.

READING I: ACTS 5:27-32, 40B-41

The disciples were arrested for preaching while under orders to desist. However, in their declaration, “We must obey God rather than men,” the disciples were defiant and continued to preach. The reference to the Holy Spirit also reinforces that both the Spirit and the apostolic word are necessary. Without the Spirit, the word is not meaningful, and without the word, the Spirit is uncontrolled enthusiasm separated from the original witness to the Christ event.

PSALM RESPONSE: Ps 30

This is the thanksgiving song of an individual freed from a deadly illness. Being brought back from the “netherworld” is applied, in this season, to Jesus’ resurrection.

READING II: REV 5:11-14

In this vision of heavenly worship, John quotes part of a hymn (“Worthy is the Lamb”) and a doxology (“To the one who sits on the throne”) that may have been part of worship in early Johannine communities. Having their own sung worship quoted as part of heavenly worship would help these communities understand their link with the reign of God.

GOSPEL: JN 21:1-19

In this post-resurrection appearance, Jesus performs a familiar miracle, which leads Peter to recognize him. He also questions Simon Peter’s love, echoing the three times Peter denied Jesus in the courtyard of the high priest. Because of his love for Jesus, Peter will also suffer death.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: Lk 24:35

The disciples recognized the Lord Jesus in the breaking of the bread, alleluia.

Right away Peter throws himself into the water and swims to the shore, toward Jesus. In that exclamation there is all the enthusiasm of the Paschal faith, full of joy and wonder, which sharply contrasts with the disappearance, the dejection, the sense of powerlessness that had accumulated in the disciples' hearts. The presence of the Risen Jesus transforms everything: darkness has become light, futile work has again become fruitful and promising, the sense of weariness and abandonment give way to a new impetus and to the certainty that He is with us."
