#### ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: PS 98:1-2

O sing a new song to the Lord,  
for he has worked wonders;  
in the sight of the nations  
he has shown his deliverance, alleluia.

#### READING I: ACTS 14:21-27

A summary of the return leg of Paul's and Barnabas's mission that has reached out successfully to the Gentiles. Upon their return they report "what God had done with them," not what they had done.

#### PSALM RESPONSE: PS 145

This poem is a song of praise for God's mighty deeds; it hails God as king, using a phrase—"God's kingdom" or "God's dominion"—that Jesus used to describe the new thing that God was planning for humanity.

#### READING II: REV 21:1-5A

The author of Revelation translates the hope for God's kingdom into the vision of a "new Jerusalem" as "God's dwelling with the human race." The divine presence transforms heaven and earth: "Behold, I make all things new."

#### GOSPEL: JN 13:31-33A, 34-35

In this part of the Last Supper discourse, Jesus proclaims that he will share in the divine "glory," and he begins to transform humanity through the "new commandment": "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you should love . . ." not me, but "one another." This love is the sign of discipleship.



#### 2019-2020 FAITH FORMATION REGISTRATION

Registration for next year's Faith Formation programs is open. We have classes for Pre-K (grades 3/4) through grade eight, as well as High School Teen Ministry. Please visit the parish website to register your children. Pre-K (grades 3/4) as well as Kindergarten meet on Sunday mornings during the 10:00 am Mass. Grades 1–8 meet on Tuesday evenings from 6:00–7:15 pm. High School Youth Ministry meets on Sunday nights from 6:00–8:00 pm. Classes for first Communion and confirmation are also being formed. You need to register your child for the sacraments. If your child was not in CCD this past year, contact the Director of Religious Education. #### HIGH SCHOOL TEEN MINISTRY

High School Teen Ministry is a great way for our teens to stay in contact with friends they have made while at St. Jane's School or CCD as well as to stay connected to the Parish. High School Youth Ministry is not CCD for high schools students. While there are times we focus on a particular topic of faith and life, everything we do is to help the teens grow in their faith and live it out by participating in social activities, service opportunities, parish involvement, and retreats. High School Teen Ministry meets about 3 times a month, mostly on Sundays from 6pm – 8pm, with an

Fourth grade started the show singing *This Land is Your Land* as the special guests paraded in to cheers, clapping, and celebration. Students whose parents serve the community in our military and police force spoke about their own experiences, as well as their parents' sacrifices for their profession. Deployments, on-call duties, and job responsibilities pull many of these first-responders away from their families at inconvenient times. We are thankful for their sacrifices, courage, and hard work to keep us safe and happy. You are truly our heroes!

#### RECYCLING CENTER

To wrap up their unit on Earth Day, the kindergarten classes visited the Montgomery County Recycling Center in Derwood. Their science unit has covered topics such as reusing, reducing, and recycling, as well as the importance of recycling to save our earth's natural resources. At the recycling center, students learned what can and cannot be recycled and how it is sorted. They were able to visit the

recycling machinery floor, and were surprised at the amount of material waiting to be recycled. This visit helped to motivate the students to go home and start recycling!

### MOTHER'S DAY SHOW

In honor of Mother's Day, the first grade students performed their annual Mother's Day Show. Mothers, grandmothers, and aunts were invited to hear the children sing songs, recite poetry, and read stories about mothers. The students painted portraits of their mothers, filled out questionnaires about their mothers, and made gifts for their mothers. The beautiful event ended with the students and their guests praying the Rosary in the Mary Garden. This is a cherished event and a fabulous way to begin the Mother's Day weekend!

### CHOIR CONCERT

Last week the our school choir performed *Dateline: Rock & Roll, the Hits of the '50s, '60s, '70s, '80s, '90s and 2000*. The spring show contained hit songs from the last 50 years. Choir members read news headlines which marked each decade's main events including the moon landing, JFK assassination, and Y2K.


