ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: PS 81:17

He fed them with the finest wheat
and satisfied them
with honey from the rock.

READING I: GN 14:18-20

Abraham's meeting with the king of Sodom, war-chief of the five armies that Abraham has just defeated, is interrupted by Melchizedek, king of (Jeru) Salem, who presents a feast to the mighty victor. Christian tradition has suggested that Christ's priesthood is related to Melchizedek (see the psalm), since he did not come from the priestly tribe of Levi.

PSALM RESPONSE: PS 110

This is a prophetic psalm, acclaiming in God's name that the king inherits the right to Jerusalem (including the priesthood of Melchizedek) and that he will be victorious in battle and a just ruler.

READING II: 1 COR 11:23-26

Paul's summary of the words of institution is followed by a text that has become one of the memorial acclamations. This reading is also used on Holy Thursday.

GOSPEL: LK 9:11B-17

Luke's account of the feeding of the multitude suggests, as do the other accounts of this miracle, that the overwhelming bounty of the reign of God is breaking into the world through Jesus' ministry. There are even twelve wicker baskets of leftovers!
