##### PSALM RESPONSE: PS 90

Subtitled "A prayer of Moses,  
the man of God,"  
this psalm is a kind of all-purpose  
communal lament.  
It begins in confident trust and  
ends with a plea for God's intervention,  
but the cause of the community's anguish  
is never specified. It is linked today  
with a refrain taken from Psalm 95.

Paul offers a reason for the community  
members to change their ways:  
They are living in Christ,  
so they should live as Christ.

##### GOSPEL: LK 12:13-21

Like Qoheleth in the first reading,

of the quest for wealth.

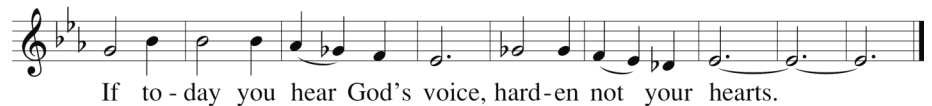
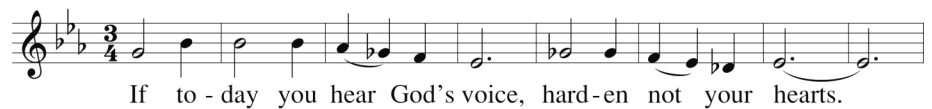
