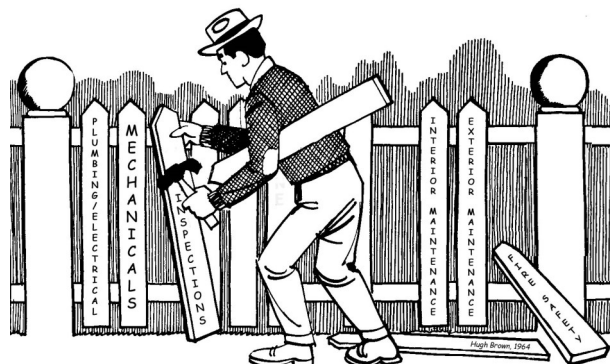

### VOLUNTEER CERTIFICATION UPDATE

The Archdiocese of Washington Child Protection Policy requires volunteers who have not been fingerprinted, as part of an ADW criminal background report, to be fingerprinted by January 2020. To assist with this process, St. Jane de Chantal school and parish are offering two opportunities for volunteers to complete the volunteer certification process: Saturday, October 5 and Saturday, November 16; both sessions will take place from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm in Caulfield Hall. Pre-registration is required. Pre-registration is a two-step process: to schedule an appointment and to pre-register with Safe Hire Solutions. Step two, to pre-register with Safe Hire Solutions, visit <https://secure.safehiresolutions.com/livescan-pre-registration-application/>. Cost is \$55 per person; payment by check (must be payable to Safe Hire Solutions) or cash (no credit cards accepted). The sessions are conducted by LiveScan Fingerprinting, which will send criminal background reports directly to the archdiocesan child protection office.
