ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: MT 3:16-17

After the Lord was baptized, the heavens were opened, and the Spirit descended upon him like a dove, and the voice of the Father thundered: This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.

READING I: IS 42:1-4, 6-7

The "servant" described by Isaiah is an enigmatic figure that may stand for the prophet himself, the "poor ones" of Israel, or the whole nation. Because of the way Jesus died, Christians saw in the sufferings of the servant an image of the One who brought life from death. In this passage the servant is anointed with the divine spirit and acts with mercy and gentleness.

PSALM RESPONSE: PS 29

The psalmist sees in a thunderstorm the sign of God's majestic rule over all creation. The image of God "enthroned above the flood" was used by early Christians as an image of God's blessing on the waters of baptism.

READING II: ACTS 10:34-38

At the end of a dramatic passage in which Peter accepts the call to baptize non-Jews, he summarizes the Gospel message: Jesus was anointed by the spirit of God to heal "all those oppressed by the devil," and that "healing" applies to all who are called by God.

GOSPEL: MT 3:13-17

In Matthew's version of the baptism story, John acknowledges Jesus' superiority, but it is only Jesus who sees the Spirit of God descending "like a dove." Presumably it is also only Jesus who hears the voice naming him God's "beloved Son," since there is no reaction from John or the crowd.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: JN 1:32, 34 Behold the One of whom John said:

I have seen and testified that this is the Son of God.



MARYLAND GENERAL ASSEMBLY

The 441st legislative session of the Maryland General Assembly Session began January 8, and runs through April 6 at midnight. Maryland Catholic Conference worked with allies during the 2019 session to successfully defeat an attempt to legalize physician-assisted suicide, oppose a proposed constitutional amendment on abortion, secure level-funding for the Broadening Options and Opportunities for Students Today (BOOST) scholarship program, prevent further expansion of the civil statute of limitations, criminalize human trafficking, and protect immigrants who help law enforcement. Yet, many of these issues appear to be far from over. Some of the major issues that will be the focus of the conference's 2020 agenda include physicianassisted suicide, a proposed constitutional amendment on abortion, challenges to the BOOST Scholarship Program, and legislative efforts focused on protecting immigrant communities. Each alert will ask you to take critical action to impact the outcomes of legislation.

Second Collection: Archdiocese for the Military Services

Our parish will particiate in the Triennial National Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services this weekend, January 11/12. The AMS was established by Saint John Paul II in 1985 to provide the Catholic Church's full range of pastoral ministries to those in the United States Armed Forces. The mission of the archdiocese is, "Serving Those Who Serve," providing the same pastoral care and services as any other Catholic diocese to Catholics serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled in in U.S. Military Academies, undergoing treatment at any of the 153 Department of Veterans Affairs' Medical Centers in the U.S., Puerto Rico

and Guam, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders, and the families of these populations. While the salaries and retirement of military chaplains are paid for by the government, the AMS receives no funding from the military or the government in support of programs and services, including Vocations, Evangelization and Catechesis, Sacramental Records, Tribunal, and Veterans Affairs. Unlike a conventional diocese, the AMS has no parishes or parish registries. The AMS has no weekly collections and relies solely on the generosity of private donations to support its programs and services. Your support for the AMS will bring the Gospel, the sacraments, and other forms of spiritual support to men and women who serve our country and defend our freedoms, including parishioners and families from our own parish.
