ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: PS 66:4

All the earth shall bow down before you,
O God,
and shall sing to you,
shall sing to your name, O Most High!

READING I: IS 49:3, 5-6

The “Songs of the Servant” describe a figure who may be a future prophet or the nation itself. The Church has applied all four of the “Servant Songs” to Jesus.

PSALM RESPONSE: PS 40

Today’s verses come from the first half of this psalm, an individual’s thanksgiving for salvation from difficult circumstances. (The second half is a lament.) Verses 7-10 are quoted in the Letter to the Hebrews to summarize Jesus’ mission.

READING II: 1 COR 1:1-3

This is the first selection in an extended (semi-continuous) set of readings from this important letter. Paul introduces himself and describes how he views the community at Corinth.

GOSPEL: JN 1:29-34

In Year A, most of the gospel readings are taken from Matthew, but the Second Sunday in each cycle reads from John—either John the Baptist’s witness to Jesus or, in Year C, the account of the wedding at Cana. In today’s text, John gives witness to Jesus as the “Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.” In this version of the baptism account, it is John who sees the Spirit descend on Jesus (compare with Matthew’s version, read on the Feast of the Baptism, Year A).

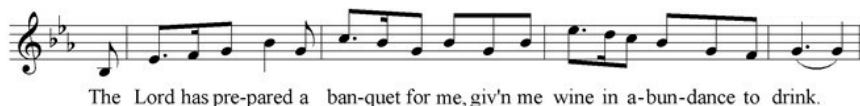

SODALITY SPOTLIGHT

The Regina Coeli unit of the Sodality is a very active unit whose members chair and support various fundraising and outreach efforts in the parish. The Giving Tree project during the Christmas holidays provides approximately 900 gifts to 18 charities and nursing homes in the area. The project also provides gifts to the retired Sisters of Charity in Greensburg, PA. The unit holds a Christmas tea at Maplewood to honor founding members of the unit as well as other ladies who reside there. The unit invites its

members as well as anyone in the parish to a monthly recitation of the rosary. The unit collects food donations in the narthex of the church and delivers them to the Shrine of the Sacred Heart parish in D.C. to assist their community. Once a year, the unit also provides meals to over 100 hungry college students at the University of Maryland Catholic Student Center. Regina Coeli offers many important ways for its members and the parish community to foster spiritual growth.

SCHOOL OPEN HOUSE

If you are thinking of Catholic education for your children, come to visit our school. St. Jane de Chantal has been educating children since 1953 and is now recognized as a vibrant 21st century Catholic school. Our faculty is dedicated to instilling and nurturing a deep religious foundation in our children. With a commitment to strong academics in core subjects of religion, math, language arts, science and history/social studies, teachers include cooperative learning and problem solving into all lessons. Students utilize Chrome books, Google Classroom, and iPads, along with textbooks across all academic disciplines. Teachers also pique student curiosity through field trips, guest speakers, and visual arts and music. Each school year, many students participate in one of more of the De Chantal fine arts programs; band, choir, dance, and theater. The science STEM Initiative is complimented by our annual March Science Madness program which involves students in all grades. Mark your calendar and plan to visit St. Jane de Chantal School on Monday, January 27, between 9:00 and 11:00 am. You will tour all classrooms pre-K to grade 8, and meet teachers, students, and parents. Applications for the 2020-21 school year will be available.

CATHOLIC MATH LEAGUE

Once again the school participated in the Catholic Math League. This is a math test given nationally to Catholic schools four times per year. De Chantal students had an outstanding performance on this past test. The third grade placed ninth in the region, with Declan Driscoll placing 77th out of 900+ students. The fourth grade placed second in region and 23rd overall out of 56 schools, with Simon Nguyen placing first in region and 20th out of 1000+ students. The fifth grade placed ninth in region, with Tyler Skibo placing 20th in region and 77th out of 1200+ students. The sixth grade placed fifth in region and 27th overall out of 72 schools, with Joey McCormick placing ninth in the region and 40th out of 1000+ students. The seventh grade placed fourth in region and 14th overall out of 41 schools, with Johnny Broome placing fourth in the region and sixth overall out of 500+ students. The eighth grade placed first in region and fourth overall out of 69 schools, with an incredible performance by David Cao who placed first in region and first overall out of 1200+ students; Brett Wall who placed eighth in the region; and Maddie Ryan who placed ninth in region.

SIXTH GRADE FIELD TRIP

The sixth grade visited the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception recently and toured many beautiful chapels that represent countries from all over the world. They also toured the Hall of American Saints, and saw the recently completed Trinity Dome. The best part of the trip was that the entire basilica was still decorated for Christmas, complete with a beautiful Nativity scene. The class attended Mass in the chapel where they were able to participate in the Mass.

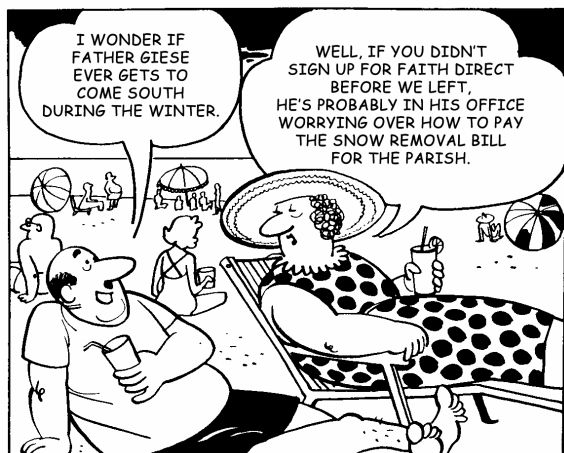
