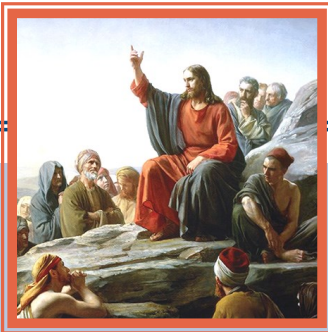


THE ORDER OF WORSHIP

Readings in *Worship* hymnal #1124

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: PS 31:3-4

Be my protector, O God,
a mighty stronghold to save me.
For you are my rock, my stronghold!
Lead me, guide me,
for the sake of your name.

READING I: SIR 15:15-20

Traditional moral teaching divided human behavior into two “ways:” the way of life and the way of death. God calls people to follow the way of life and does not force anyone into the way of death.

PSALM RESPONSE: PS

These excerpts from the longest psalm in the Psalter (176 verses!) praise both those who follow God’s way and the law (Torah) which lays out that way. The final verse of today’s excerpt asks for wisdom—insight into how everything fits together in God’s plan.

READING II: 1 COR 2:6-10

Paul indicates that he taught at several levels. There is the basic announcement of the Good News (see last week’s second reading), but he also taught in deeper ways (and, probably, relying more on his rabbinical training) for those who could understand it. Still, he claims no credit for this deeper teaching: It is the work of the Spirit.

GOSPEL: MT 5:17-37

In this section of the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus calls his disciples to complete fidelity to the divine will in all circumstances. He quotes examples from the “oral Law” (for the most part) and follows them with commands that go to extremes to show how devoted people must be in their “yes” response to God.

SODALITY SPOTLIGHT

The St. Monica Unit assists St. Jane Frances de Chantal parish and the surrounding community in many ways. In keeping with their goal of supporting underprivileged mothers and their children, the women of St. Monica have started donating their time and treasure to the DC Diaper Bank (DCDB). In November, the unit gathered at a DCDB warehouse and wrapped almost 8,000 diapers to be distributed to families in need. They will visit the warehouse again this April 15. The members will also serve dinner at the Catholic Student Center at the University of Maryland on February 26. The St. Monica Unit is equally involved in the activities of the General Sodality; they provided the refreshments at the Christmas Meeting and Craft for the ladies of Sodality this past December and they will again coordinate and run the parish Red Cross Blood Drive on April 5. The busy ladies of the St. Monica Unit enjoy working together to help the community and support a life of charity and spirituality.

S.O.M.E. VOLUNTEERS

On Wednesday, January 29, our parishioners proudly provided the mid-day meal for So Others May Eat (S.O.M.E.), feeding between 300 - 500 of our neighbors in need. S.O.M.E. is an interfaith community-based organization that uses a holistic approach to help meet the daily needs of the homeless and poor in the DC area. In addition to serving meals, they offer job training, affordable housing, medical care, treatment and counseling. Their mission is to restore hope and dignity one person at a time, and we are doing our part to help. St. Jane De Chantal has been preparing meals for S.O.M.E. since 1979 – 41 years! We provide lunch whenever there is a fifth Wednesday of the month, roughly 4 to 5 times per year. For each meal, a diverse group of nearly 70 members of our parish work together to coordinate, cook, bake, and deliver lunch to S.O.M.E. 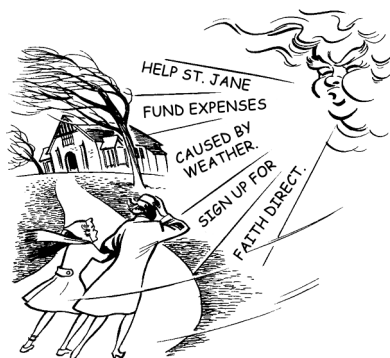
