
THE ORDER OF WORSHIP FOR THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT



Readings in Worship hymnal #1027

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: PS 91:15-16

When he calls on me, I will answer him; I will deliver him and give him glory, I will grant him length of days.

READING I: GN 2:7-9; 3:1-7

This reading has connections to the second reading as well as the Gospel.

The story is taken from the second account of creation in Genesis (the first account, Genesis 1:1–2:2, is read at the Easter Vigil.)

Tempted by the devil, the very first humans reveal a pattern that is repeated in every generation: We sin.

PSALM RESPONSE: PS 51

A lament, the most famous of the seven Penitential Psalms, prays for the removal of the personal and social disorders that sin has brought.

READING II: ROM 5:12-19

Reflecting on what seems to be an almost ingrained pattern in human existence, Paul uses fairly convoluted arguments to show how what happened in Jesus is much more than what happened in Adam and Eve. Not only did Christ overcome the effects of sin in the world, the grace of God went further.

We are not merely restored to the state of humanity before sin; we have been elevated to reign with Christ.

GOSPEL: MT 4:1-11


The story of Jesus' temptation is intended in Matthew's version to show that he not only resists sin, where Adam and Eve did not resist, he resists three times, where they fell after Satan's first attempt.



LENT IN OUR PARISH

FASTING & ABSTINENCE

All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence for those age 14 and above. On weekdays during Lent, there is no obligation to fast, however, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended.

CARPOOLING WITH CHRIST

"Carpooling with Christ," a holy hour with Eucharistic Adoration, will take place each Tuesday of Lent from 2:00 -2:45 pm in the church. Whether you are in line for carpool or happen to be passing by St. Jane, all are welcome to come in for a few minutes of prayer, or to stay the entire time.

CONFESSIONS & ADORATION

This Lenten season, each Catholic parish in the Archdiocese of Washington will have the opportunity for confession available every Wednesday evening (except Ash Wednesday). Confessions at St. Jane will be heard from 6:45-8:00 pm. This time on Wednesday evenings at St. Jane will also offer the opportunity for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. DEACON "COME AND SEE" EVENTS

Permanent deacons are called to a special ministry of service through which they assist the poor, the hungry, the sick, the homeless, the imprisoned, immigrants, and others. As ministers of God's Word, deacons proclaim the Gospel at Mass, preach, and teach. They also exercise various liturgical roles, including baptisms, witnessing marriages, and preside at funerals, wakes, and graveside services. The Office of Permanent Diaconate Formation of the Archdiocese of Washington will begin a new cycle of recruitment and preparation of men for the diaconate, beginning with an aspirancy program in October of 2020. The initial selection process for this class will begin with a series of "Come and See" events at various parishes around the Archdiocese through March 2020. 
