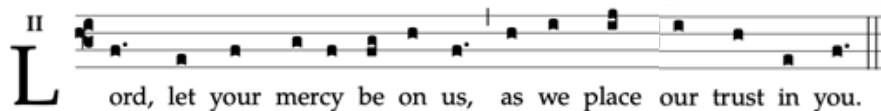

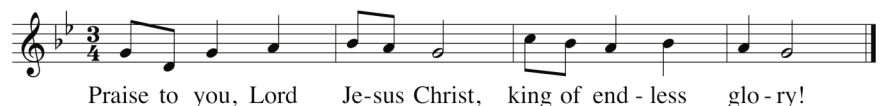

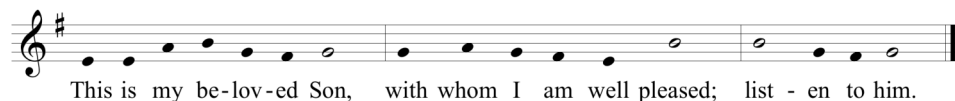

### DEACON "COME AND SEE" EVENTS

Permanent deacons are called to a special ministry of service through which they assist the poor, the hungry, the sick, the homeless, the imprisoned, immigrants, and others. As ministers of God's Word, deacons proclaim the Gospel at Mass, preach, and teach. They also exercise various liturgical roles, including baptisms, witnessing marriages, and preside at funerals, wakes, and graveside services.

The Office of Permanent Diaconate Formation of the Archdiocese of Washington will begin a new cycle of recruitment and preparation of men for the diaconate, beginning with an aspirancy program in October of 2020. The initial selection process for this class will begin with a series of "Come and See" events at various parishes around the Archdiocese through March 2020.
