ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: PS 25:15-16

My eyes are always on the Lord,
for he rescues my feet from the snare.
Turn to me and have mercy on me,
for I am alone and poor.

READING I: EX 17:3-7

By God's mercy, using Moses as the divine instrument, water gushes from a barren rock at Horeb. The miracle is two-edged, however, because the people doubt that God could provide water in the desert, so it goes down in memory as a kind of edgy blessing. (Tradition held that because Moses hesitated and doubted God at Horeb/Massah/Meribah, he was denied entrance to the Promised Land; he was only allowed to view it from a distance, from the top of Mount Nebo.)

PSALM RESPONSE: PS 95

Used as the daily "invitatory" to begin the Church's Liturgy of the Hours, Psalm 95 encourages us to use "today" to hear God's voice and not to doubt as the people did "at Meribah/as in the day of Massah in the desert."

READING II: ROM 5:1-2, 5-8

God provided water in the desert, but Christ laid down his life for us.
There is no greater love.

GOSPEL: JN 4:5-42

The story of Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman is used by John to make several points. The Samaritan believes and gives witness to Jesus when even his followers don't understand who he is. He is "living water" which comes alive in believers as the source of eternal life. Jesus' disciples do not need to go to a particular place to worship, because they worship "in Spirit and truth."

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: JN 4:13-14

For anyone who drinks it, says the Lord, the water I shall give will become in him a spring welling up to eternal life.

STEAM THROUGHOUT DE CHANTAL

STEAM topics, involving science, technology, engineering, art, and math, are investigated daily at St. Jane de Chantal School. Throughout the month of March, students will share with our parishioners through the bulletin some of the

STEAM projects they have been involved in. First Grade has started their unit on Earth Science by learning about the water cycle! They have learned a song teaching them the big vocabulary words: evaporation, condensation, and precipitation. They have also investigated different types of clouds, and did an experiment with shaving cream. Next, they will pretend to be meteorologists and learn how to forecast and report the weather! The eighth grade is focusing on the periodic table and the properties of different elements. Seventh grade just began studying the effects and causes of disease and infection, and how our immune system is built to fight off harmful bacteria. Lastly, sixth grade is covering why we experience changes in climate and seasons, and how earth's climate has changed over millennium. Science is everywhere at De Chantal!

DEACON "COME AND SEE" EVENTS **CANCELLED**

As ministers of God's Word, deacons proclaim the Gospel at Mass, preach, and teach. They also exercise various liturgical roles, including baptisms, witnessing marriages, and preside at funerals, wakes, and graveside services. The Office of Permanent Diaconate Formation of the Archdiocese of Washington will begin a new cycle of preparation of men for the diaconate in October 2020.
